We turn a high-risk time into an opportunity for the young person to effect positive change in their lives through changing their attitudes and building respect and trust for themselves, peers and others.

The students have grown in self-esteem and confidence through compiling, preparing and presenting the completed project to their peers and school.

The school and community benefits from the change in the attitude of the students and they become engaged in their education.

A concluding report will be presented to the Principal and School Trustees.

The NFT programmes support the Papakura Plan to provide pathways for young people (who have been at-risk) to become engaged in their education and setting goals for future training and employment. The signs of disengagement and behaviour problems have been identified by the school and NFT has the reputation for helping some of the toughest students remain in school, wanting to learn. The NFT programmes also create safer communities where people feel safe by reducing juvenile crime as students are in school, reducing family violence and conflict as the students take responsibly for their actions and behaviour.

The Lead Mentor is of Maori heritage and 80% of the young people referred are Maori. Research shows for each cohort of Maori students entering Year 9 approximately 60% will leave school before they reach Year 13 (MoE, 2009a).

A lack of engagement with schooling and educational qualifications is connected to low-paid employment; unemployment; benefit dependence, crime and imprisonment (Department of Corrections, 2007). Most concerning statistic of all, is that Maori make up 51% of the prison population despite being 15% of the population and generally, prison inmates have significantly lower rates of literacy and numeracy than the rest of the adult population (Department of Corrections, 2007; Lashlie, 2003; Walker, 2007)

NFT programmes have been successful in addressing these issues.

Promoting Smoke Free: The programmes do not specifically promote a smoke free message however during the programme the young people evaluate all their behaviours resulting in improved self-esteem and greater respect for themselves. The cycle of underachievement is broken and social change is happening as young people set and achieve goals and change their mind-set on the potential they have for their future including healthy and career choices.
