Project title	Coastguard Maraetai - Saving Lives At Sea

Location	Waitemata Harbour, Hauraki Gulf, Firth of Thames, Bream Head to Cape Colville
Summary	<p>Coastguard Maraetai is one of the busier Sea Rescue units in the Northern Region. We are on call 24/7.</p> <p>In the past 12 months we attended 170 incidents (10 were urgent - the vessel is launched within 10 minutes) and brought 491 people home to safety.</p> <p>The 35 crew contributed over 7000 volunteer hours - Rescues (over 1700 hours) Training (2300), Boat checks and maintenance (1000). Fundraising (660) and Administration (1250).</p> <p>In 2018 we will be undertaking a mid-life refit of Maraetai Rescue 1 boat in order to extend its useful life as a Coastguard Rescue Vessel. This will entail some modifications to the boat, repaint for corrosion prevention and new electronic navigation and search equipment.</p>

Community benefit:	<p>The Boating and Beach Going Community are our immediate beneficiaries, 50% of boaties rescued were from South Auckland in the past year.</p> <p>During the Mayday fund raising campaign we run a family focussed open day to demonstrate the equipment and activities involved in Coastguard work.</p> <p>Our Summer Lottery Sales campaign engages with businesses and organisations in our community and The Annual Charity Golf Day is an opportunity to work with Pohutukawa Coast Rotary, Pohutukawa Coast Sea Rescue Trust and Clevedon Lions to encourage the wider community to support Coastguard Maraetai. Coastguard Maraetai supports community activities including the local Christmas Parade, Trolley Derby, Maori Tri, Rotary Mid-winter Swim, Ocean Swim events and Power Boat Racing.</p> <p>Coastguard Maraetai undertakes an annual recruitment drive in April to encourage and inspire others in the community. Part of the Coastguard mission is to provide public education in water safety in an effort to positively influence</p>

	the behaviour of the boating public.
Actions taken to date:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Search and Rescue activities are ongoing. - Public boating Education is ongoing - The Midlife refit is a one off expense in 2018

Financial information

Coastguard Maraetai costs around \$80,000 per year to operate (annual accounts and budget attached). We maintain our rescue vessel, launch tractor and trailer and other rescue equipment to ensure we are ready to respond 24/7 and within 10 minutes of an urgent call. Crew train on the water every week and in the class room to maintain and improve skills. Coastguard Maraetai is keen to deliver Boating Education to the public in our community.

1. Training fuel alone costs over \$10,000 per year
2. Rent of the boat shed and meeting room \$5600 per year
3. Our share of Vessel refurbishment ~ \$28,000 this year
4. Our share of Electronics replacement ~ \$7500 this year
5. Our share of Vessel replacement - \$300,000 in 10 years
6. Our training programmes cover all aspects of vessel management, risk and hazard identification and management and personal survival

Summary	<p>Due to the lack of cell phone reception and long stretch of Coastline, the Surf Club relies heavily on VHF Radios as their primary form of communication. We are looking to replace our current Radios with modern, digital technology. GPS Units allows us to pinpoint locations to get the resources we need on scene more efficiently.</p> <p>Emergency Flares are used as a secondary means of communication when help is needed.</p>

We will be using these funds towards replacing the Karioatahi Surf Club VHF radios, handheld GPS Units & emergency flares. The VHF Radios will be used most often as these are an essential piece of equipment used when patrolling a beach.</p> <p>When the Karioatahi Surf Club and Call Out Squad is faced with more complex exercises & real life search/rescues, the Handheld GPS Units & emergency flares become vital to the success & outcomes of these operations.</p>
Community benefit:	<p>The successful result of this project will allow the Lifeguards at Karioatahi beach to carry out their patrols more efficiently.</p> <p>The upgraded Radios, GPS Units & Flares all reduce the response time for Lifeguards to arrive at an incident. The people requiring our help could be anyone using the beach, from Swimmers, Vehicle users, Horse Riders or people simply enjoying the beach.</p>
Actions taken to date:	We have already sourced recommendations and quotes from Suppliers regarding the equipment which would be most suitable for this project.
