










Section 2: Your evidence:



9 March 2018 Evening

On Friday evening (9th March) several car loads of people were drinking. They were very disruptive with yelling and loud music. Glass bottles were thrown over the bank and smashed on the road.

One neighbour rang the police and another rang the council and the glass was finally removed on Sunday. A registration number was also reported.

Section 3: General comments:

Are there any other measures that could be taken to help prevent the alcohol related crime or disorder you are witnessing/experiencing?

- **Locking the carparks in the cul de sac at night.** This would probably be the best option to reduce the crime and disorder from alcohol and drug use in the area. Almost all the individuals drinking or taking drugs get to the area by driving a vehicle. They do not live nearby.
- **Security camera:** Installing security cameras would firstly reduce the number of alcohol related incidents by deterring criminals and their associated behaviour. Secondly the police could use the camera for surveillance - recording number plates and vehicles.
- **Littering/dumping rubbish signs:** re-erect signs about littering etc (some have been vandalised).
- **Police community warden presence:** If there was more routine patrolling by police and wardens this would help to ensure those that regularly drink in the area that it was being monitored and stop the disruptive behaviour
- **Rubbish bins:** I'm not sure this would actually help - as the type of people coming up most likely will still litter and smash bottles etc.
- **Speed humps:** Place speed humps in the cul de sac to reduce burn outs and loud lowered cars.
- **Better lighting.** There is currently only one street light, which means it is difficult to be able to see cars, occupants and registration numbers on the vehicles. It also makes it an unsafe area for people walking the tracks at night, especially in winter when it gets dark early.

Are you aware of any community based initiatives in your local board area to reduce alcohol related crime or disorder?

No we are not aware of any wardens patrolling the area. We do have a neighbourhood support group, which every house on Gollan Road from Tidey Place up to the cul de sac are included in. We have regular correspondence and meet once/twice a year. We have been mowing the berm in the cul de sac until recently to keep it nice and tidy (undertaken this for approx 5 years). We recently stopped mowing the berm due to the amount of broken glass, litter and unsafe rubbish such as condoms, human feces and syringes found in the grass. We have to continuously ring the council now to get the berm around the carparks mowed.

The new heritage trail which has significant cultural importance to the area starts at the carparks in the cul de sac and therefore I would suggest that the local board would have an interest in ensuring that the area is maintained without crime and disorder.

Do you have any further comments to support this request?

We have submitted this form on behalf of our neighbourhood support group and others in the area who would like to see some support in reducing the criminal, disorderly behaviour that the carparks bring. The entire community in Gollan/Harding and neighbouring streets, including areas in Stonefields closeby want to see some change and support from the council, local board and police to reduce the negative anti-social behaviour to make our community safer.

The Gollan Rd cul de sac is where several walking tracks converge, it is also a place where people can park and walk up Mt Wellington. It has great views and is generally a lovely place for people to enjoy. We also have 30-40 school aged children who live on Gollan/Harding Roads and walk to

Stonefields School past the cul de sac every day on a walking school bus and really should not have to see what they see. Unfortunately the actions of a few (mainly at night) have really made the area feel unsafe. The carparks are inviting to a select group of individuals who wish to park their vehicles, drink alcohol, take drugs and engage in very anti-social behaviour such as play loud music at all hours of the night, yell, scream, swear, fight, leave litter including broken glass, condoms, syringes, spray graffiti everywhere, trespass on neighbouring private property, leave vomit on private property and in the cul de sac and cause general disruption. Bottles and rocks are also being thrown down the bank at the end of the cul de sac and there are houses below in Stonefields, which is another concern for those residents. Last weekend one of the residents informed us that rocks had hit their house from individuals parked at the cul de sac. They rang the police to notify them of this.

The surrounding neighbourhood includes many families with young children, single Mums and Elderly. We have tried to discourage the negative behaviour by mowing the berm, picking up rubbish on a daily basis to keep the area respectable and tidy for all to enjoy, however it does not seem to be helping. We have asked individuals in the cul de sac on occasions to pick up their rubbish or to down down their car stereos as they are waking up our children and keeping people awake, however have been met with aggression and often feel intimidated. When we call the police they are either too busy or believe it is not a serious enough issue to come visit the area. When families are kept up all hours of the night with loud partying, it causes a lot of stress. We really don't want neighbours to get so frustrated that they take matters into their own hands and something bad happens.

Many of the vehicles also do burn outs in the cul de sac (which is quite obvious from the black tire marks in the cul de sac), speed humps could be a way to reduce this issue.
