Public Transport Users Association	Representatives from the Public Transport Users Association were in attendance to discuss their campaign for trains to Huapai.	At the meeting the local board members were invited to sign a pledge card in support of trains to Huapai.
Tender Road – road maintenance issues	Andrew McNeill and Ron Clark of Tender Road, Dairy Flat, were in attendance to highlight road maintenance issues on their road.	The presentation has been forwarded to Auckland Transport who is responsible for the maintenance of the road. The road was graded and rolled in the second week of May and the water channels were cleared at the same time. In addition, an Auckland Transport engineer has visited the site and noted that some of the issues raised about drainage relate to runoff from concrete driveways that is causing scouring at the access of the properties. Property owners are responsible for clearing their own culverts, but the engineer identified a couple of cut-outs and discussion is already underway with some of the landowners.
Residents of Sunnyside Road, Coatesville	Several property owners who reside in the Lionel Hart subdivision off Sunnyside Road, Coatesville, were in attendance to outline their disappointment with the recently approved road name of 'Hartway Grove' for their right of way.	The Rodney Local Board Transport, Infrastructure and Environment Committee approved the name Hartway Grove at their business meeting on 19 April 2018. The Senior Subdivision Advisor advised the applicant to consult his neighbours, but this was not a legal requirement. Should residents on the right of way wish to revisit the name of the road they will need to have the support of a minimum of 75% of the nine properties that access the right of way and follow the council process for reconsideration of the road name.
