

Attachment A – Previous requests and decisions on membership to the World Health Organisation Global Network of Age-friendly Cities and Communities

Date and meeting	Request and decision
8 May 2018 Environment and Community Committee	The committee requested a report on the advantages and any obstacles to Auckland Council becoming a member of the World Health Organisation Global Network of Age-friendly Cities and Communities (ENV/2018/56).
19 March 2018 Seniors Advisory Panel	At this meeting the Seniors Advisory Panel recommended to the Governing Body that Auckland becomes an age-friendly city as soon as possible.
1 September 2016 Regional Strategy and Policy Committee	The committee resolved to not join the World Health Organisation Global Network of Age-friendly Cities and Communities. Instead directed staff to progress the intent of the framework to become a friendlier city for a range of populations (REG/2016/92).
2 June 2016 Regional Strategy and Policy Committee	Committee supported the recommendation in principle for Auckland to become a WHO Age-friendly City. Directed staff investigate and report back on the merits and implications of Auckland becoming a WHO Age-friendly City (REG/2016/35).
30 March 2016 Community Development and Safety Committee	This committee recommended that the Regional Strategy and Policy Committee proceed with accreditation of Auckland as an age-friendly city (COM/2016/28).
7 October 2015 Community Development and Safety Committee	The committee requested advice from staff on the process and cost of becoming an age-friendly city (COM/2015/57).
