These wananga are a two day wananga, targeting people who have not woven before and have been hugely successful. Participants learn how to harvest – we have been harvesting the fibre from Glenfield Road, which has helped to tidy up the site. At the end of the courses we will organise a day , partnering with Kaipatiki Project to clean up all the plants on Glenfield Road.</p> <p>We run this course from Northcote Citizens Centre. The Centre is a great space for this type of activity. Todate we have had had:120 people through our courses. There are two more courses to go this year. Feedback from all participants is that they would like to see more of this happening in our area.</p> <p>Wednesday night Weaving continues to happen from within Marlborough Park Youth Space. The numbers have increased since our weaving wananga started.</p> <p>The Kaipatiki Weaving Roopu have been approached by The Dealands TV Series, and asked if we could do some weaving for their up and coming TV Series The Deadlands. This was a great learning opportunity for some of the weavers, who agreed to make Tatua for the show. They are enjoying this process.
