Homes and Places	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides urban amenity/public urban space for local communities</li> <li>• Creates opportunities for connected and accessible new housing development</li> </ul>
Environment and Cultural Heritage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Considers and prepares for potential future impacts of climate change</li> <li>• Minimises environmental impacts, including biodiversity risks of marine industry and impacts on the marine environment resulting from on-land activity</li> <li>• Maximises opportunities to restore degraded environments</li> </ul>
Transport and Access	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Safeguards access as a current or future public transport interchange</li> <li>• Safeguards equitable access to the water for a range of users</li> </ul>
Opportunities and Prosperity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Delivers long-term, integrated (social, economic, cultural and environmental) value to Auckland.</li> <li>• Supports growth in Auckland's maritime activities and industries.</li> </ul>
Belonging and Participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supports and enhances Aucklanders' connection to marine environment.</li> <li>• Provides facilities / amenities to enhance social outcomes for the local community (e.g. community facilities, shared public spaces).</li> </ul>
Māori Identity and Wellbeing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supports mana whenua wellbeing, needs and aspirations and opportunities to showcase Māori identity</li> </ul>
