Description:	<p>Ruapotaka Marae would like to create more opportunities to promote the education of Te Ao Māori me Tikanga (the Maori world and its protocols) for the community of Tāmaki and other communities within the boundary of their Maungakiekie-Tamaki local board area. The focus for this project is to uphold the traditions of Māori and their protocol and history of local stories. The ambition is to share in local schools and households within Tāmaki, which aligns to responding to Māori aspirations. The teachings will be guided by Māori values, kaupapa Māori or maatauranga Māori, including activities that have strong storylines and themes that educate or allow the participants to experience Māori traditions and world views.</p> <p>Ruapotaka Marae seek to create interactive educational workshops for their communities to learn local history through Māori practices, waiata and haka that will be composed to tell local stories and encourage local peoples to use in appropriate forums and also raise the awareness of how they as a culture traditionally look after Papatuanuku (Mother Earth) and the environment.</p> <p>Ruapotaka Marae is confident that their initiatives culturally align to multiple outcomes of the Local Board.</p>

Name:	Wriggle and Reo
Description:	<p>Wriggle and Reo is an introduction to Māori culture and reo for local families of all ethnic backgrounds, made up of an engaging weekly 30 min session of kōrero and waiata, aimed at 0 -5 year olds and their whānau/kaitiaki.</p> <p>Wriggle and Reo is modelled on the popular Wriggle & Rhyme / Rhyme time / Mainly Music and other song/story programmes we have within our communities, however is specifically designed to drive understanding and uptake of Te Ao Māori & Te Reo Māori.</p> <p>Another strong driver for this programme is to establish further connections between Māori and non-Māori parents in the area, e.g. by having te reo Māori speakers to lead the sessions and to introduce participating tamariki & whānau to Māori concepts and culture.</p> <p>Further, in the longer term, this programme will open up further mentoring & coaching opportunities within the community, by engaging and employing others to create, promote and distribute Māori-centric content through the digital marketing and running of the programme.</p> <p>Sessions would usually be 30mins long, made up of greetings, introductions to a theme, related stories told and songs sung, vocabulary learned, with the sessions ideally preceded or followed by coffee/tea & biscuits for more social exposure for parents and children.</p> <p>The priorities above are attained as this programme is designed to bring Māori, Pākehā and other non-Māori communities together, specifically young families, in public spaces, to learn about and celebrate tikanga Māori.</p> <p>Social enterprise is also activated as it opens up an opportunity for Māori-centric content creation and promotion.</p>

Strategic alignment

Identified need:

Within the Maungakiekie-Tāmaki community there is a very large desire to learn te reo Māori and ensure that tamariki are growing up with an innate appreciation of Te Ao Māori. This programme allows for an engaging, fun, low pressure introduction for parents and whānau as well as for children, which will help to make the reo a part of families' lives into the future.

While there are many programmes to learn the language, there are no classes in Auckland where parents can learn with their children. This gap within our local communities has been felt in multiple ways by parents - one parent asked whether they could bring their child to a daytime reo class and was told the toddler would disrupt other learners. Those from Wriggle and Reo know that people within the parenting community have also tried to find a kids' programme so that parents can learn alongside children but have not found any. Therefore, this programme will make this more accessible to both children and parents within our local communities.
