Summary	In the first week of the Oct school holidays, Brickworks Drama School will offer 9am-3pm drama workshops for 6 - 10 year olds and 11 - 15 year olds. Each workshop is a self-contained, themed day led by qualified drama tutors (see bios attached). Students enrol for selected days or the whole week. Each day ends in a showing for families. Workshop themes are: Physical Theatre; Improvisation; Voice; Storytelling; and Pacific Performance. Our two 2016 holiday workshops received excellent feedback. (Please see attached letters of support.)		
Requesting grant for	Towards venue hire, costume and craft material costs. (Each day the students complete a craft activity related to the theme of the day. They take their creations home, to share their drama activities with their families.) Last year's holiday workshops each ran at a loss of \$800 - \$1000 in order to keep fees affordable for local families. The July workshop was supported by Creative Communities funding. Running the workshops without funding in Sept/Oct 2016 we absorbed an \$836 loss, even with reduced tutor fees. This is unsustainable for us as a local non-profit organisation.
