WHAT WE PROPOSE TO FOCUS ON

Below is an overview of the six outcomes we are proposing to focus on. Our plan is based on the ongoing feedback and ideas that our community has given to us.

1. A network of vibrant and loved urban neighbourhoods

To help our diverse neighbourhoods flourish, we'll focus on:

- working with Panuku Development Auckland on high-quality intensification in Henderson's metropolitan centre
- supporting young people to contribute to their communities, such as the young people at Kakano Youth Arts Collective who have created wonderful art in Henderson
- supporting community projects such as street clean-ups and plantings
- supporting a calendar of signature events across the local board area which reflects our diversity

2. A thriving local economy that supports quality of life

To support a successful local economy we will:

- support business groups, such as the Henderson-Lincoln Business Association, to deliver their strategic plans for improving local prosperity
- work with our community partners to identify and fund opportunities to get people, especially young people, ready for work or in further education
- partner with Auckland Tourism, Events and Economic Development to encourage competitive industries to grow in our area.

3. Communities know each other and work together on common interests

We want to enable people and organisations at the local level, to enable them to shape their quality of life. We will help them do this by:

- establishing ways for people to connect with the local board as decision-makers, such as neighbourhood forums or via social media
- supporting residents to improve the communities they live in through small local initiatives, such as street barbecues, picnics and Neighbours Day events
- developing relationships and shared goals with local Māori and key Māori organisations
- working on long-term funding agreements to support community groups to focus on what matters locally.

4. Community facilities are vibrant and welcoming places at the heart of our communities

We want council parks, libraries and community centres to contribute to building strong, healthy communities. We aim to achieve this by ensuring:

- our parks and recreational services provide a range of accessible experiences for our diverse community
- we partner with the community sport and recreation sector to encourage residents to be more active
- our community facilities are well used and flexible in meeting community needs.

5. It is easy to get around without a car

We want smart, effective and green public transport options that people actually use. We will contribute to this by:

- working with Auckland Transport, New Zealand Transport Agency and neighbouring local boards to improve and expand on our walking and cycling path network
- advocating for the construction of a dedicated busway along the north-western motorway from Westgate to the city
- partnering with our many community interest groups to promote ways of getting around without a car.

6. Natural spaces are valued and restored

We want to protect and sustain our environment by:

- bringing communities together at a neighbourhood level through environmental projects to reduce waste and pollution, save water and energy, and restore and enhance our streams
- supporting the role of Māori as kaitiaki (guardians) of the environment when developing community and council projects
- restoring indigenous ecosystems and promoting private native planting
- promoting the integration of water saving, energy and waste reduction, and eco-friendly transport options in council facilities.
