Jacky was engaged by Auckland Council to work with Mana Whenua to provide guidance and training on completing their specialist inputs for their nominated sites of significance. As part of the role Jacky mentored a new staff member providing training in the role of Specialist.

Jacky also co-developed training materials and tools for Mana Whenua to help them better understand the Plan Change process and importance of their specialist inputs. Jacky also provided guidance to Mana Whenua on how to articulate their values in a consistent and robust way to inform the plan change process.

Jacky was engaged by Auckland Council to help support the Project Lead to undertake programme management tasks. This included development of a detailed work programme, identification of resource requirements, financial reporting, budget management and development of individual contracts with the 19 Mana Whenua groups.

Jacky was seconded to the Long-Term Plan 2015-2025 (LTP) team to work with Council's co-governance entities to identify funding requirements for consideration through the LTP process.

This included reviewing relevant Treaty Settlement legislation and Environment Court documents to understand the financial obligations of each arrangement. Jacky coordinated a series of workshops with each of the co-governance entities that were in operation at the time and key staff from across council to identify funding requirements and reporting those requirements to the Budget Committee for decision making. A key outcome of the role was the development of a new process for the consideration of co-governance funding through the current and future LTP processes.

Tupuna Maunga ō Tāmaki Makaurau - Annual Operational Plan 2015

Senior Project Manager – Co-governance | Financial Plan Policy and Budget Team | Sept 2014 – March 2015

Jacky developed a process for preparation of an Annual Operational Plan for the Tupuna Maunga o Tāmaki Makaurau Authority (Maunga Authority), which could be incorporated into the Council's Annual Plan and Long Term Plan Processes. This was a requirement of the relevant Treaty Settlement legislation that an Annual Operational Plan be prepared by the Maunga Authority and aligned with the Auckland Council Annual Plan and Long Term Plan processes.

Jacky coordinated with key staff from across the Council to identify opportunities for integration of the two processes, and reported regularly to Maunga Authority workshops and meetings to develop and agree an approach.

A key outcome of the role was the development of a new process for the consideration of co-governance funding through the LTP process including a process specifically tailored to meet the requirements of the Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014.

Auckland Council - Interim Papakāinga Development Grants Policy 2015

Senior Project Manager – Co-governance | Financial Plan Policy and Budget Team | Feb – March 2015

Jacky worked with Council's experts in Development Contributions, Legal Services and Te Waka Angamua to prepare an Interim Papakainga Development Grants Policy to allocate \$500K of funding to eligible Papakainga developments.

Auckland Council – Te Toa Takatini, Māori Transformational Projects – Financial Reporting

Jacky worked closely with Te Waka Angamua, Finance and the Independent Māori Statutory Board on improvements to the way Māori Transformational Projects were reported on across Council. This included providing inputs to quarterly reports to the Finance and Performance Committee on Māori Priority Projects identified in the Annual

Plan 2014-2015 and working with Te Waka Angamua and Governance to develop a combined report on all Māori Projects across Council. Part of this role was to work with key departments across Council to inform them of the reporting and to work with them to simplify how projects were identified and reported through Councils financial reporting system.

Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan – Plan Preparation

Principal Planner – Treaty of Waitangi Workstream Lead | Auckland Council | Feb 2011 – Nov 2013

Jacky was responsible for developing and leading the Treaty of Waitangi work programme. The Treaty of Waitangi provisions were developed over a two year period in partnership with Mana Whenua (19 Iwi Authorities) and representatives of the Independent Māori Statutory Board (IMSB). This included governance hui, a series of individual hui and technical workshops and seeking feedback on drafts of the Plan at key milestones in the process.

Key tasks included:

- Scoping the Māori outcomes to be included in the Plan, including developing an agreed Mana Whenua and Auckland Council response to Treaty Settlement legislation, NZ Coastal Policy Statement and NPS Freshwater Management;
- Review of the Plan provisions against the RMA requirements, best practice and national policy guidance;
- Managing a team of planners and subject matter experts responsible for engagement, research and drafting the Treaty of Waitangi provisions;
- Scoping the work stream budget and resource requirements through the Plan development process;
- Development of the mana whenua engagement approach and coordination with 19 iwi authorities, related Unitary Plan work streams (Rural, Infrastructure, Natural Environment, Coastal and Heritage) and delivery arms of Council (Resource Consents, Heritage, Te Waka Angamua);
- Political Reporting (Unitary Plan Political Working Party, Independent Māori Statutory Board (IMSB));
- Review of submissions and engagement with key stakeholders on the draft provisions prior to notification.

Jacky was the lead author of the Regional Policy Statement – Issues of Significance to Mana Whenua and Cultural Impact Assessment provisions and reviewer of the Māori Land, Treaty Settlement Land, Māori Cultural Heritage and Regional provisions relating to consideration of Mana Whenua values.

The Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan Mana Whenua engagement process received a special award at the Auckland Council Consultation and Engagement Awards in 2013.

Kaipara District Plan Review – Plan Preparation

Jacky led a team of eight planners working on various aspects of the District Plan Review. Jacky worked in partnership with Te Roroa and Te Uri o Hau to prepare the Tangata Whenua Strategy, Māori Land and Treaty Settlement Land provisions.
