We would like to keep the costs to schools as low as possible in order to make our work accessible to all. Each performance and workshop delivery takes a day of the company's time to deliver, plus approximately a week of management time to liaise and plan.

**Cost of participation:** \$5 per head for the performance, and \$250 for the workshop. But we vary this cost dependent on the schools finances, and often provide free performances if the schools arts budget is minimal - frequently the case.

## Community benefits

### Identified community outcomes:

Increased awareness of the impact of waste, especially plastic, on the environment, generating a ripple effect in the Papakura with greater awareness of waste as a potential resource, and more waste minimisation activity with less waste to landfill; growth in entrepreneurship and opportunities for business development among stall holders. We hope to create a greater demand by consumers for ecofriendly practices in the Town, e.g.: reusable bags-single use plastic free town, ecofriendly packaging and products.

### Alignment with local board priorities:

- reduce the amount of waste taken to landfill each year from Papakura
- support innovation and social enterprise

The Sustainable Papakura market actively reduces waste to landfill through the recycling activities of stall holders and the purchasing of these products by consumers. This same activity also educates consumers to view waste as a resource. In addition to this core activity the trust uses the market as a venue to raise awareness and provide education about waste minimisation practices. This is reinforced by providing paper and cloth bags to reduce single use plastic, and children' activities using recycled materials. The market has created the nucleus of a growing recycling community. The Trust has also undertaken a survey of retailers in the central business area to gauge attitudes and practices in relation to waste minimisation and recycling. This has provided

useful information which, when collated, will provide a basis for further initiatives, particularly to reduce the use of plastic bags. However it also proved a useful opportunity to educate and inform, and to identify recycling champions and innovative practice and informal networks among businesses. The Trust is therefore contributing to the overall wellbeing of residents and businesses and their environment by creating community around the issue of waste minimisation and resource conservation.
