There is the potential for this group to become a social enterprise.</p>

- 2- These people create an item, a bag: students are pulled away from their screens and have a chance to be creative, using their hands.
- 3- We help solve an environmental issue: reducing the amount of plastic which floods into our oceans.
- 4- We collaborate with other NGO in order to get the bags into communities and have conversations about the environment.
