The physical relationship between Picton Street and UXBRIDGE Arts and Culture needs enhancement, there is minimal visual connection and if in place, this could strengthen pedestrians relationship with the Centre. This installation will create a visual relationship that will draw the public from Picton Street to UXBRIDGE and will encourage more foot traffic to both the library and UXBRIDGE from Picton Street.

This installation will be programmed to be part of the Arts Out East Festival in May 2018. This project will be a fantastic large scale event to signpost the Festival and lure pedestrians to come and take part over the opening weekend.

This project is all about showing art to the community. We would like to see art interactions and installations happening throughout our community and this project brings exciting contemporary art into the public sphere.
