The representatives from the Lions Club in Warkworth will be encouraged to work with council's Strategic Broker in regard to the proposal.
Te Arai groups; Save Te Arai Inc and NZ Fairy Tern Trust	Ms Rogan of the NZ Fairy Tern Trust and Mr McConchie of Save Te Arai Inc. were in attendance to outline various concerns in relation to Te Arai, and in particular the installation of weir which they consider has impacted on the food source of the Fairy Terns and altered water flow.	The local board has referred the issue regarding the construction of a weir to the Regulatory Team for a response. A letter will be written to the groups addressing this and other matters raised in due course.
Kumeu Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association	Mr Sinton and Mr Hammond of Kumeu Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association outlined various matters in relation to the Kumeu Huapai area.	The issues raised by the Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association were noted.
Northland Waste	Ray Lambert of Northland Waste was in attendance to discuss Auckland Council's draft Waste Management and Minimisation Plan.
