AT – Speed Management <i>(Adam Moller, Jenny Long, Kenneth Tuai)</i>	Oversight and Monitoring	<p>Speed affects the outcome of every crash. High risks roads are assessed and come up with recommendations for change in speed limits. AT is developing a list of priority sites using the new national tools.</p> <p>Cavendish Drive has a mix of residential and industrial areas and so the speed along residential area will be changed to 50kmph which the Board was supportive of.</p> <p>East Tamaki Road – 50kmph up to Peat Baker Drive.</p> <p>Papatoetoe Town Centre – part of St George Street, side roads, Shirley Road</p> <p>Hunters Corner Town Centre – parts of Great South Road to be changed to 40kmph.</p> <p>Otara Town Centre – 40kmph</p> <p>Manukau Town Centre – 40kmph</p> <p>Puhinui – Future Development Area change to 80kmph.</p> <p>Bairds Road & Grey Avenue issue with speeding.</p>

Update on LED Work Programme (Luo Lei & Jonathan Sudworth)	Oversight and Monitoring	<p>Little India Research Project –</p> <p>Local residents will be surveyed by face-to-face on the streets, hard copy surveys and online surveys to gauge the support among local businesses, community organisations and the wider community and pursue the concept of an authentic Indian precinct. Establish a direction for Hunters Corner Business Association to articulate the character and aspirations of being the 'Little India' of Auckland.</p> <p>The Board is happy with the hard copy survey except that on the last page Samoan is not mentioned.</p> <p>The Board suggested that the face-to-face survey be conducted this Saturday at the Papatoetoe Family Fun Day and also at various community network meetings.</p> <p>Action: Survey will be conducted during Dec/Jan and will be reported back to the Board in Feb/Mar 2018.</p> <p>Board wants younger people to surveyed like the Youth Council.</p> <p>Migrant Business Support Programme -</p> <p>Business start-up workshops</p> <p>Deliver business advice sessions to migrant business owners</p> <p>Promote existing activity more effectively.</p> <p>Board suggested to work with TSI and Samoan Business Network and also the programme should be called New Migrant Business Support Programme.</p> <p>Workshops should support new migrants as they need support to understand the rules, laws, etc that are needed to start business in New Zealand.</p>
