BREED ASSESSMENT 1

On 12 September 2017 I completed a breed assessment with my colleague Jason Sherman for Stephen Nahu and his dog Lukah.

At the time Lukah was friendly with the staff but unsettled in this unfamiliar environment. Stephen walked his dog Lukah into the Assessment room where he held his dog in order for us to take photos. I cannot recall if Stephen was there for the entire duration of the assessment.

I recall Stephen telling us how his dog was well trained and friendly, he also mentioned something along the line that he trained German Shepherds for police but cannot be sure of the exact words of this conversation.

Lukah scored 58-60 and was found to be predominantly of Pitbull type.

**This was my first official breed assessment.*

BREED ASSESSMENT 2

In August I received a notification in my calendar that I would be doing a breed assessment on 10th August 2018 and was told by Louise that it was for Stephen Nahu and his dog Lukah. Louise reminded me that I had already done an assessment on the dog previously and explained that Stephen had requested another assessment.

Stephen walked Lukah into the assessment room. Lukah was boisterous and pulling on the lead. Stephen said there must be a bitch on heat. (There were no bitches on heat in the shelter at the time).

Lukah was friendly but unsettled. He constantly walked toward the door wanting to leave the room.

Louise began the assessment as normal explaining the process of the assessment to Stephen and showing him the training booklet. He became frustrated with the conversation, he did not want to look at the booklet and continued to argue the use of the word desex, saying "tell it like it is, it castration". Louise showed him the previous registration forms and offered to give him a copy.

Stephen asked us several times to go easy on them, saying he's not a Pitbull, he's a Rottweiler x. I said I have a Rottweiler and Lukah is not a Rottweiler.

He said his dog looks like the one on the Text 2 Desex flyer. Louise told him that was a Pitbull.


Lukah scored 50-49 and was found to be predominantly of Pitbull type.

Louise advised Stephen that if he was not happy with the outcome he could take it to a hearing.

I handed Stephen the Outcome of Breed Assessment Letter.
