

## SUMMARY OF MANA WHENUA CONSULTATION

Below is a summary of the Mana Whenua iwi authorities that were consulted over the proposal to revoke the reserve status of the local purpose (road) reserve adjoining 18 Parrs Cross Road, Henderson and 18 Edwin Freemans Place, Ranui, and their responses:

- **Ngati Te Ata Waiohua**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018, with follow up e-mails sent on 2 October 2018 and again on 17 October 2018. Iwi advised that while they had a historical interest in the area of the reserves, they would defer comment to Te Kawerau Ā Maki and Ngāti Whātua o Kaipara.

- **Ngāti Whātua o Kaipara**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018. Iwi advised that they would defer to Te Kawerau Ā Maki for comments.

- **Ngāti Whātua o Ōrākei**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018. Iwi advised that while these reserves are within their rohe, they are outside their area of primary interest and are content to defer to other iwi.

- **Te Akitai Waiohua**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018, with follow up e-mails sent on 2 October 2018 and again on 17 October 2018. No response received.

- **Te Kawerau Ā Maki**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018, with follow up e-mail sent on 2 October 2018. Iwi confirmed they are mana whenua for this area and therefore have a cultural interest in all developments. Iwi enquired as to the future plans for these sites if reserve status was revoked. Iwi were provided with the following response:

If in the event the reserve revocation process is successful, Council intends that the land may be sold to an adjoining owner or on the open market as reserve land is surplus to Council's requirements as the two reserves in question are not required for Council's current or future service.

No further comment was received from the iwi.

- **Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua**

A letter outlining the proposal was sent to iwi on 10 September 2018, with follow up e-mails sent on 2 October 2018 and again on 17 October 2018. The following response received:

Our review of the information provided for consideration confirms the following:

- The Mana Whenua interests of Ngāti Whātua in the area of the proposed development;
- Defer those interests to Kawerau in anticipation of their provision of an appropriate response accordingly;
- We also anticipate that our future involvement will be determined following due consideration by Kawerau as well; and,
- We provide this response pro bono in our quest to support public good through managed growth and development.
