Summary:	Funding would enable us to distribute free spacers & Educational pamphlets to the Manurewa community. A spacer is a tube-like accessory that extends the mouthpiece of the inhaler and directs the medication towards the mouth. The valves open to release the medication when breathe in. These devices can be especially helpful in young children and in patients of any age who are prescribed an inhaled medication & corticosteroid for use of Asthma or COPD.		
Expertise:	<p>Asthma NZ have been supporting those with asthma and COPD (Chronic Obstruction Pulmonary Disorder) for 52 years. We are the largest not for profit provider of respiratory education, training, and support in New Zealand and keep 87% of our patients out of hospital.</p> <p>All our Mobile Asthma Nurse Educators are registered and hold New Zealand Nursing Council practicing certificate.</p> <p>We know that with knowledge comes power—the power to manage one's health effectively gives a level of self-worth and confidence that extends into all areas of life. Our Nurse Educators travel the community meeting with people in places and spaces that are convenient for them. We go into people's homes, schools, workplaces and community centres.</p>
