Our passion is to grow our local community and young people through providing transformative opportunities using creative arts. We place a focus on reaching out to those who do not have access to these kinds of opportunities due to finance, transport or family barriers. We want to provide safe and empowering environments with skilled facilitators and event managers that will develop young people & their community in confidence through the arts, their passions while discovering tools to continue thriving.

This project will provide pathways for dancers which bridge them into other opportunities like national championship events, further dance training, or network people with supportive community leaders. The goal is not to entertain with performances but to connect people to supportive community spaces that are local to them.

We believe in locally lead projects. Those who host are locals from Mangere, Otahuhu, Otara & Papatoetoe. They are passionate about their regions and contributing to community to be proud of their suburbs which is why hosting this event in Otahuhu is a priority.

The project will take place at a newly renovated Otahuhu Creative Studio situated at Affirming Works - 9 Moa Street, Otahuhu. This space is owned by Affirming Works who has collaborated with LH Combine Artists to ensure it is effectively used for youth and South Auckland Creative art purposes.

LH Combine Collective have a passion to see young people fill the 200sqm mirrored studio with dance, music, performing art showcases, events and programmes that will bring attention to Otahuhu/Mangere and surrounding suburbs celebrating our diversity and unique voices. This particular project attracts a wide range of audiences throughout 4 days, bringing them to Otahuhu to experience our culture, local food and expressive atmosphere carefully crafted to not only meet local community needs with opportunities but also celebrate who we are to wider audiences.

In the past two years LH Combine have found 50% Maori/Pacific people are participating and leading projects/programmes. This project continues that priority. We are inclusive to all however our events attract a large portion of Maori/Pacific young leaders who come from the community we serve and that is represented in the ethnic demographic involved.
