Summary:	Glow Night is a Halloween alternative aimed at providing free fun games and activities to children under twelve years old in a safe, smoke-free and fun-filled environment with free lolly bag and light refreshment while their caregivers enjoy each other's company with free tea and coffee and food. The adults are welcome to join in the fun games with their children.		
Expertise:	We have hosted Glow Night in the past few years. Our church volunteers (more than 70 of them) have also helped in the past. We have volunteers to do decorations, to provide and serve the food, to do welcome and connect with the visitors, to lead the games, to do the sound and lighting and to provide first-aid care and to keep the place safe. Our church also had outdoor International Street Food Festival and indoor Global Cafe, both are open to the public.

Community benefits

Identified community outcomes:

Any family with children under 12 years old are welcome to Mt Albert Baptist on 31 October, Halloween evening, between 6pm to 8pm for fun games, bouncy castles, activities and opportunities to connect with likeminded parents for two hours. At least one of the bouncy castles to be hired is suitable for older siblings (teens and young adults) of the family. The parents will not have to worry about their children knocking on strangers' doors and all the possible dangers associated with that or subject to the weather. Apart from the outdoor bouncy castles, all the games and activities will be held indoor in the auditorium and the cafe and there are plenty of seats for the caregivers to chill out.

Our church is smoke-free and we will only print out sufficient flyers (A6) for schools which prefer paper flyers to electronic ones and for participants in our community programs. All other promotions will be electronic. There will be water dispensers near the kitchen and fruits in each treat bag for the kids and for adults.

Children under 12 years of age with their parents are all welcome to join our Glow Night irrespective of their gender and ethnicities. As the games are mostly hired for young children, older children are also welcome but they may not find the games interesting.

Summary:	With your funding we can provide free Asthma test using the FeNO testing in the community and schools. This test can help to confirm an asthma diagnosis in adults and children. Asthma affects a young person's ability to concentrate and learn. Asthma interferes with athletics and causes many to drop out from their favorite sports. We provide free spacers and Peak Flow Meters to manage their condition. Specially young people will never go to a Pharmacy to purchase these medical devices. But if they were given these devices part of their education; they will use it to self control their condition.		
Expertise:	Our free service was valued for the last 52 years. W see an increase in self-referrals, i.e. patients contact us directly for education, training and support - Schools have been asking us to increase the number of days we are visiting as they see a significant improvement in the way in which students manage their asthma after they have connected with a Nurse Educator. Asthma NZ receive hundreds of support messages/emails/letters from patients, Healthcare providers, schools and community groups.

We acknowledge the Council in our Annual report as well. Our Nurse Educators are in the community visiting homes, schools & Rest homes, events. They always mentioned our funders and thank them for helping us to keep our community healthy.		

Community benefits

Identified community outcomes:

Our mission is to reduce Asthma and Chronic-Obstruction-Pulmonary Disease-(COPD) hospitalisation by 50% by 2029. NZ have one of the highest rates of death for under 35 years olds in the world. Children with uncontrolled Asthma who are systematically evaluated by our home visiting Mobile Nurse educator; showed a significant and clinically relevant improvement in their condition. Our Mobile Nurse Educators role as that of a facilitator, enabling the parents to work in the way that suits them best at their homes.

Cigarette smoking is the predominant cause of COPD. Exposure to environmental tobacco smoke has been linked to asthma in early childhood exposure and active smoking has been associated with a rapid decline in lung function in asthma and COPD. Our Mobile Nurse Educators provide Smoking-cessation as the primary goal of the management with asthma & COPD.

Health literacy remains alarmingly low, 80% of Maori, 90% of Pacifica are unable to find, interpret and use health-services to make effective decisions for their health & well-being. Our Education keep 87% of our patients out of hospital. We know that with knowledge to manage one's health effectively gives a level of self worth and confidence that extends into all areas of life.
