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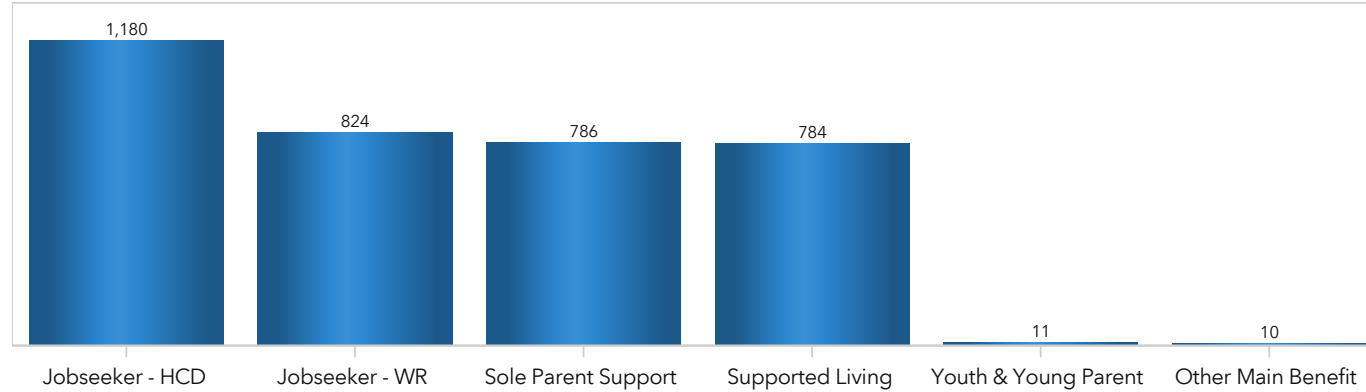
As at 03/2024, there were 3,595 people in receipt of a Main Benefit in the Auckland Board of Rodney. 55.7% are in receipt of Jobseeker Support. 4.4% identify as Pacific, 23.9% Māori, 70.9% European and 5.1% identify as Asian MELAA or Other ethnicity. The number of people in receipt of a Main Benefit decreased by 31 since Dec2023.

41.1% of Jobseeker clients are in receipt of a Job seeker work ready benefit and 58.9% have a health condition or disability.

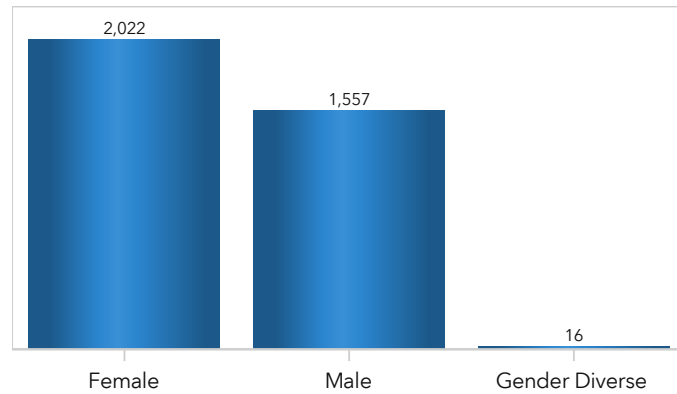
56.9% of Jobseeker work ready clients have been on benefit continuously for one year or less. 22.6% are youth aged 18-24 while 23.9% are aged 25-34. The number of jobseeker work ready clients has decreased by 21 since Dec2023.

61.2% of Jobseeker work ready clients are Male. 62.5% identify as Europeans and 31.1% identify as Māori.

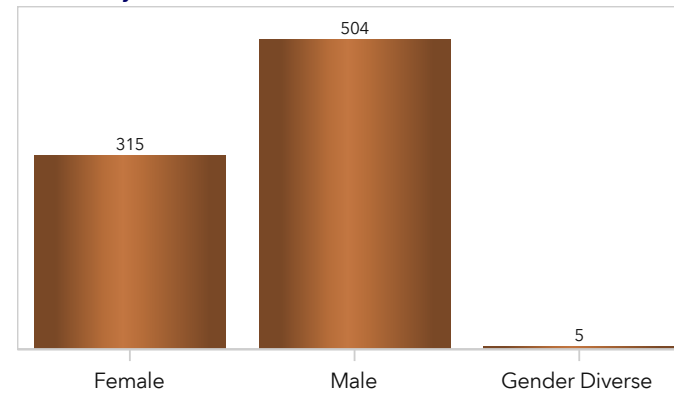
1. Benefit Type



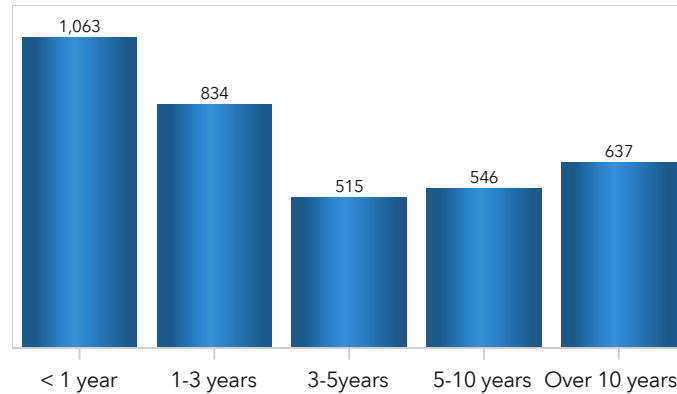
2. Gender



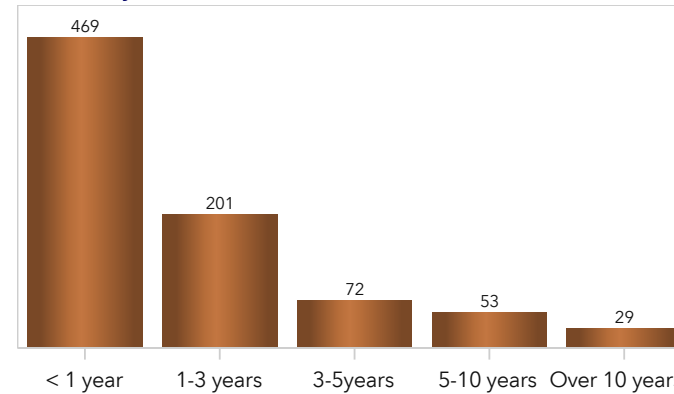
3. JSWR by Gender



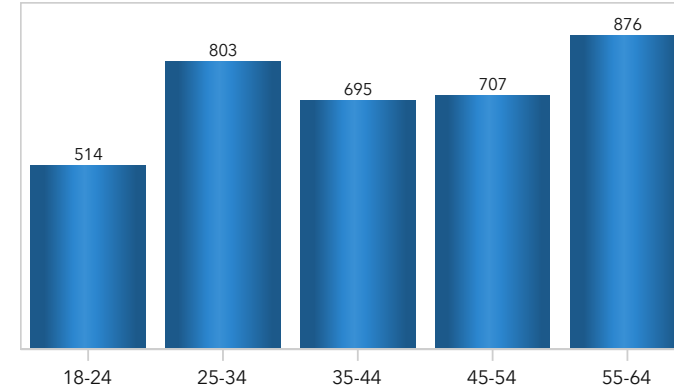
4. Continuous Duration



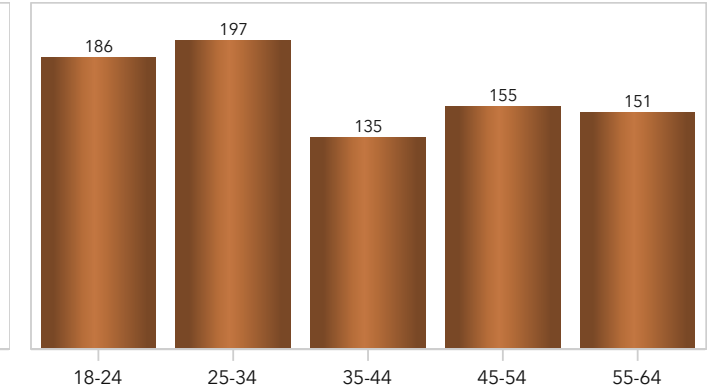
5. JSWR by Continuous Duration



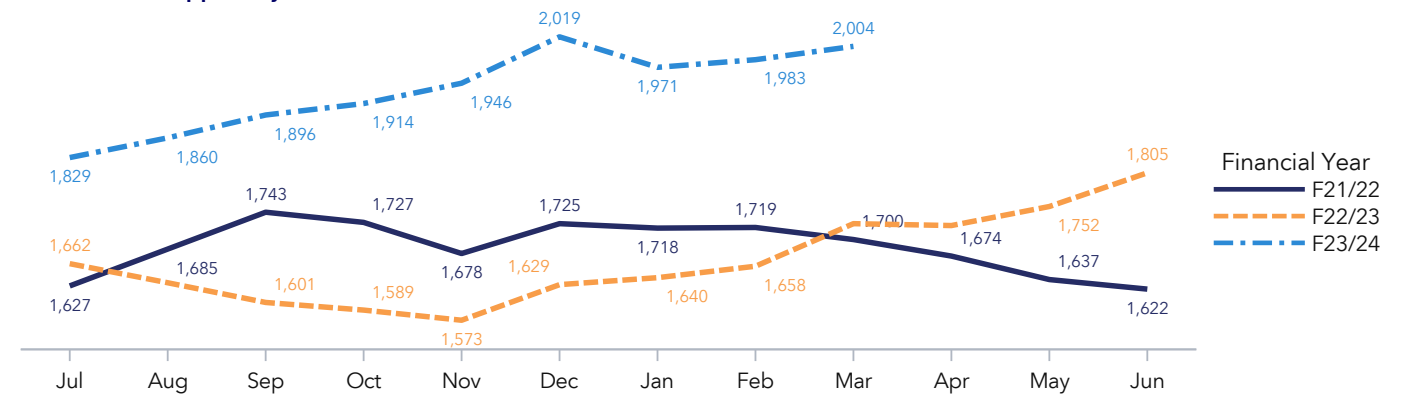
6. Age Group

## WHAT DO WE NEED?

There has already been a huge increase in our local population over the last 5 years and much more growth is predicted to come.

Given the work completed to date, and funds invested, the Warkworth Showgrounds complex is positioned as the main sporting and recreational hub for the area - but the clubs that are there need to be able to accommodate the future growth and are sorely limited by our footprint (surrounded by roads, bush, residential development).

Other local clubs are also experiencing huge growth but do not have the facilities to enable them to deliver good quality training and playing experiences which means the potential to have to turn members away.

The Structure Plan for Warkworth doesn't designate good, suitable land for future sport fields (without huge initial cost) so ensuring our existing fields are fit-for-purpose is **key!**

MCSRC and all the associated clubs and groups are very united and supportive of each other in ensuring each club has what it needs to deliver top class options for the community.
