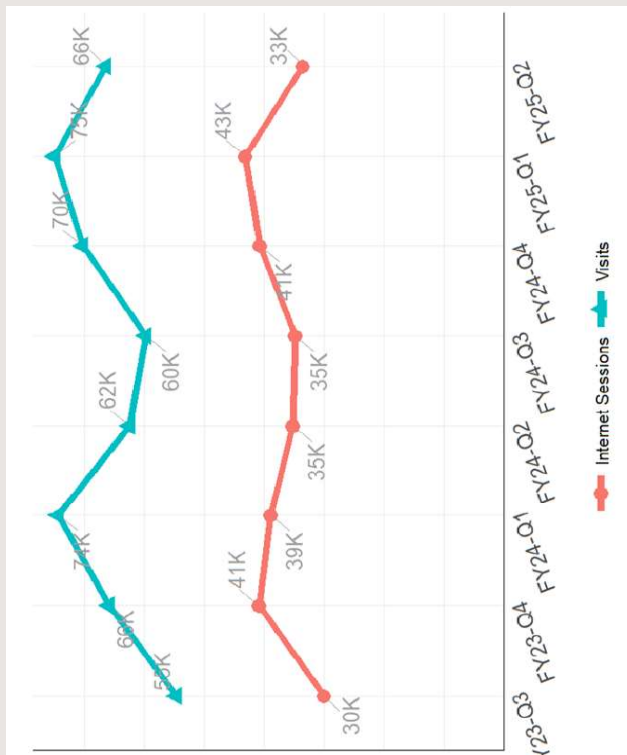

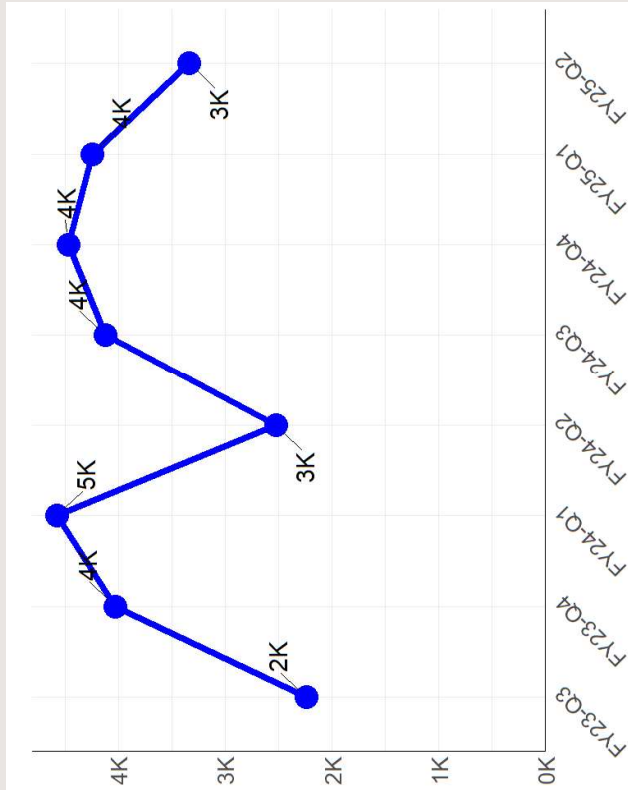

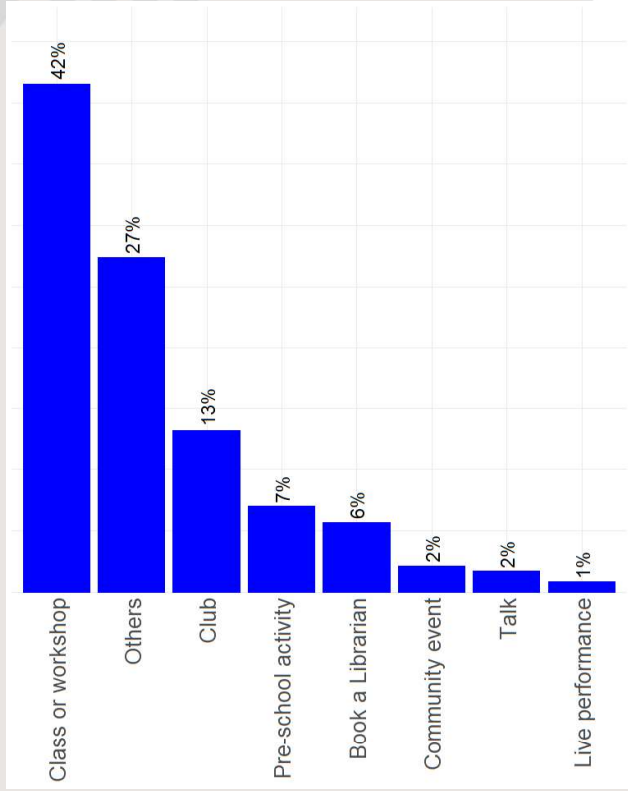


Performance: Library Activities

Number of participants for programmes and events

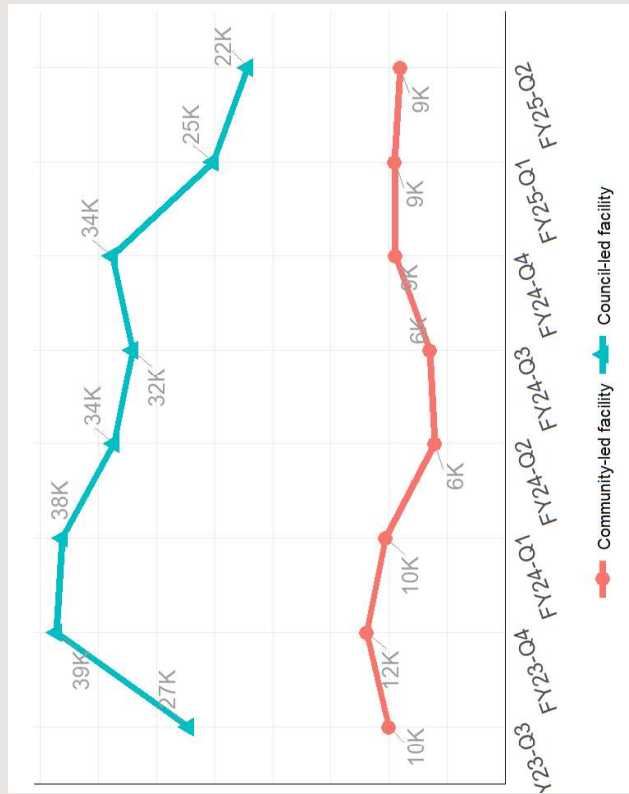


Breakdown of activities delivered

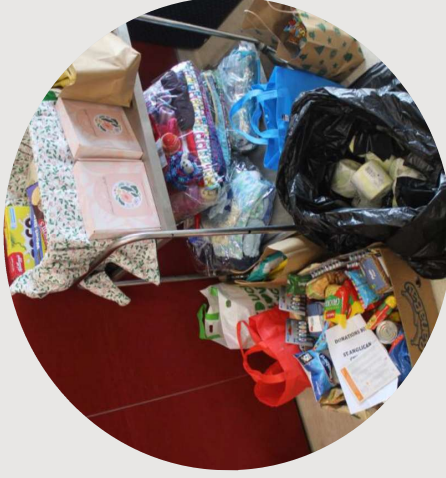

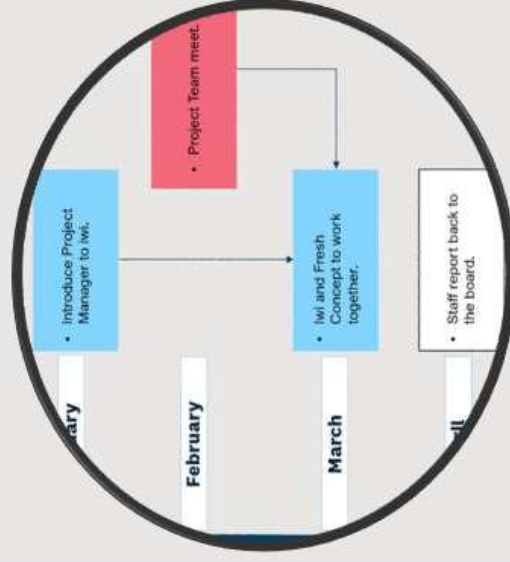
266 - Manurewa build resilient connected communities

- Services for Manurewa Local Board, with a focus on cost savings and outcomes, valued at \$10,000 at a discounted community rate of \$6,000, representing a 40 per cent cost saving.
- Key achievements include securing over \$180,000 for local groups through funding and tenders, providing cultural and language expertise and strengthening governance and leadership within the community.
- The reduced rates were applied due to a strong personal commitment to the Manurewa community, demonstrating excellent value for money and supporting the board's goals of empowerment and resilience.

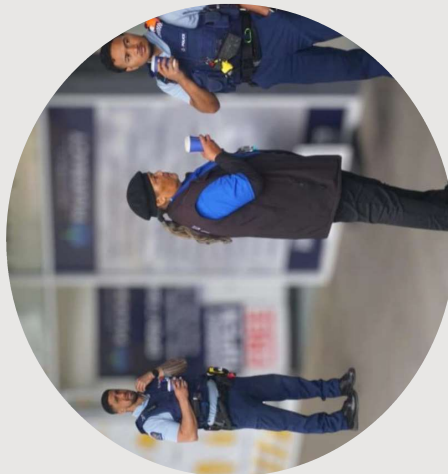

Ongoing CCTV monitoring has provided numerous footage for local businesses this quarter and has also supported police with investigations.

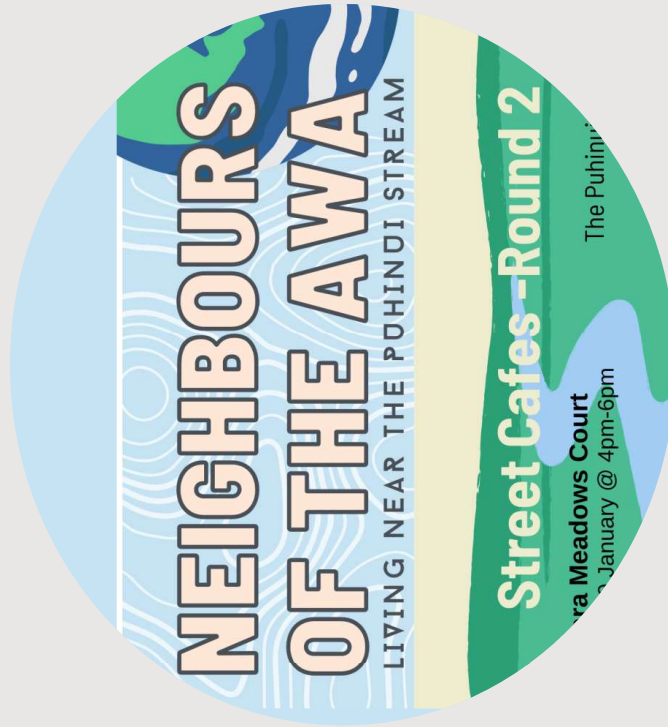
