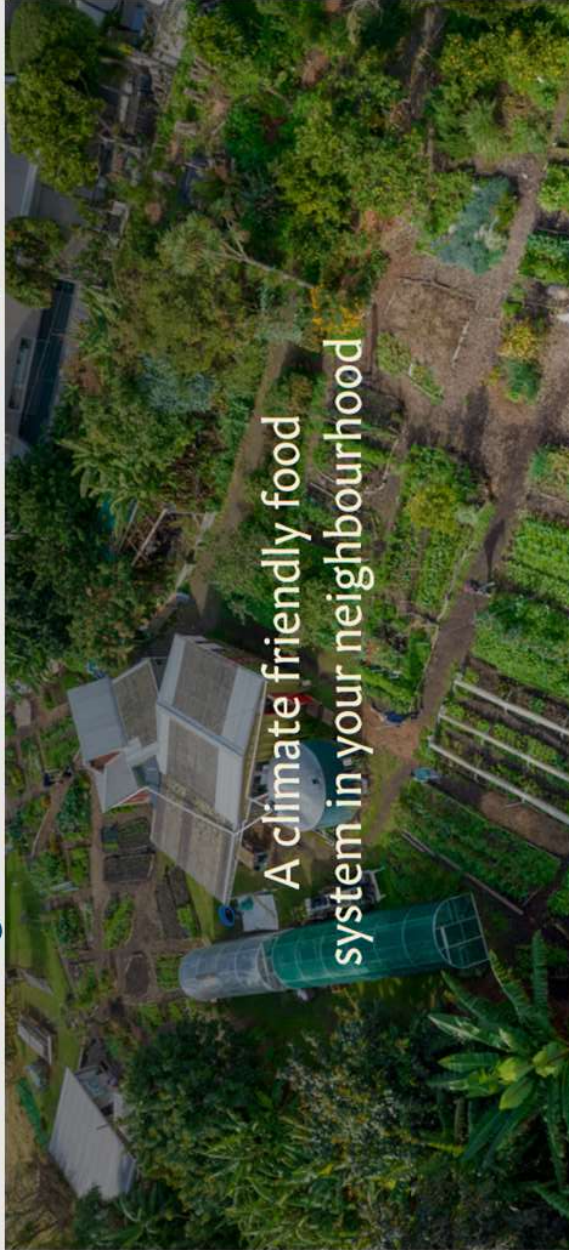
Gardens for Health – Diabetes Aotearoa



The Gardens4Health (G4H) programme, connects 111 community kai gardens and 23 community and religious services across the city, to promote sustainable and affordable strategies for growing nutrient dense kai and healthy soil.



Kelmarna Community Gardens (1981 to now)



Kelmarna is a 40+ year old organic community farm in Central Auckland on a mission to transform our food system.

Our journey began in 1981 when Paul Lagerstedt secured the lease from Auckland Council, giving rise to the Kelmarna Community Gardens Trust.

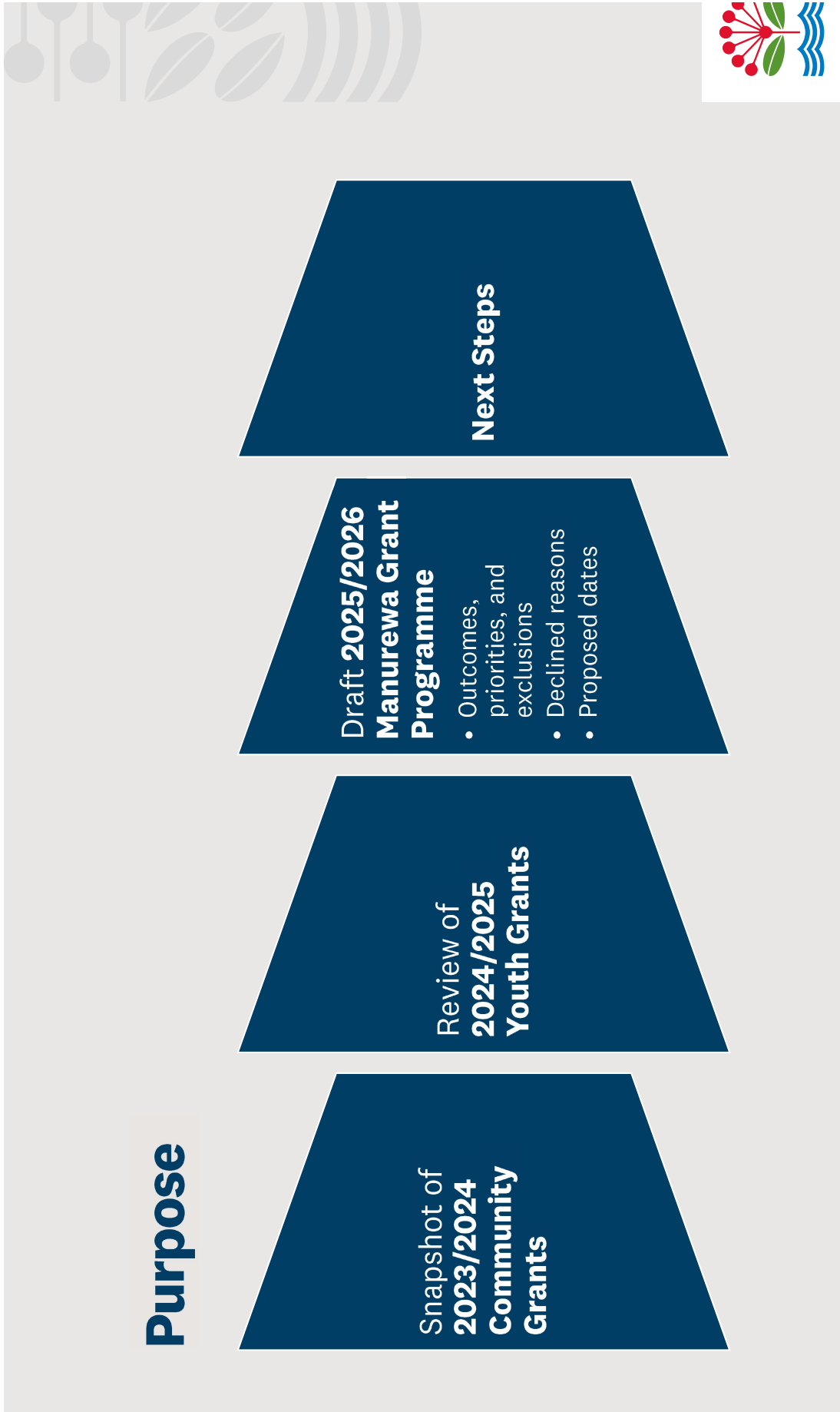

Review of Manurewa Local Board Grants Programme





2023/2024 Grants Overview



Funding Allocation

A total of **\$206,448.12** was allocated in 2023/2024.
\$294,228.00 was allocated in 2022/2023, reflecting a reduction in funding.

Applications Received

162 applications were received from **119** unique community groups or individuals.
This marks a 21% increase from 2022/2023, which had 133 applications from 93 groups.

Project Delivery

88 projects have been or are being delivered in the Manurewa Local Board area with Local Board funding support in 2023/2024.
This is a slight decrease from 92 projects in 2022/2023, primarily due to budget adjustments

Community Group Support

67 community groups were supported through the Local Board grants rounds in 2023/2024.
This is consistent with the 66 groups supported in 2022/2023.
