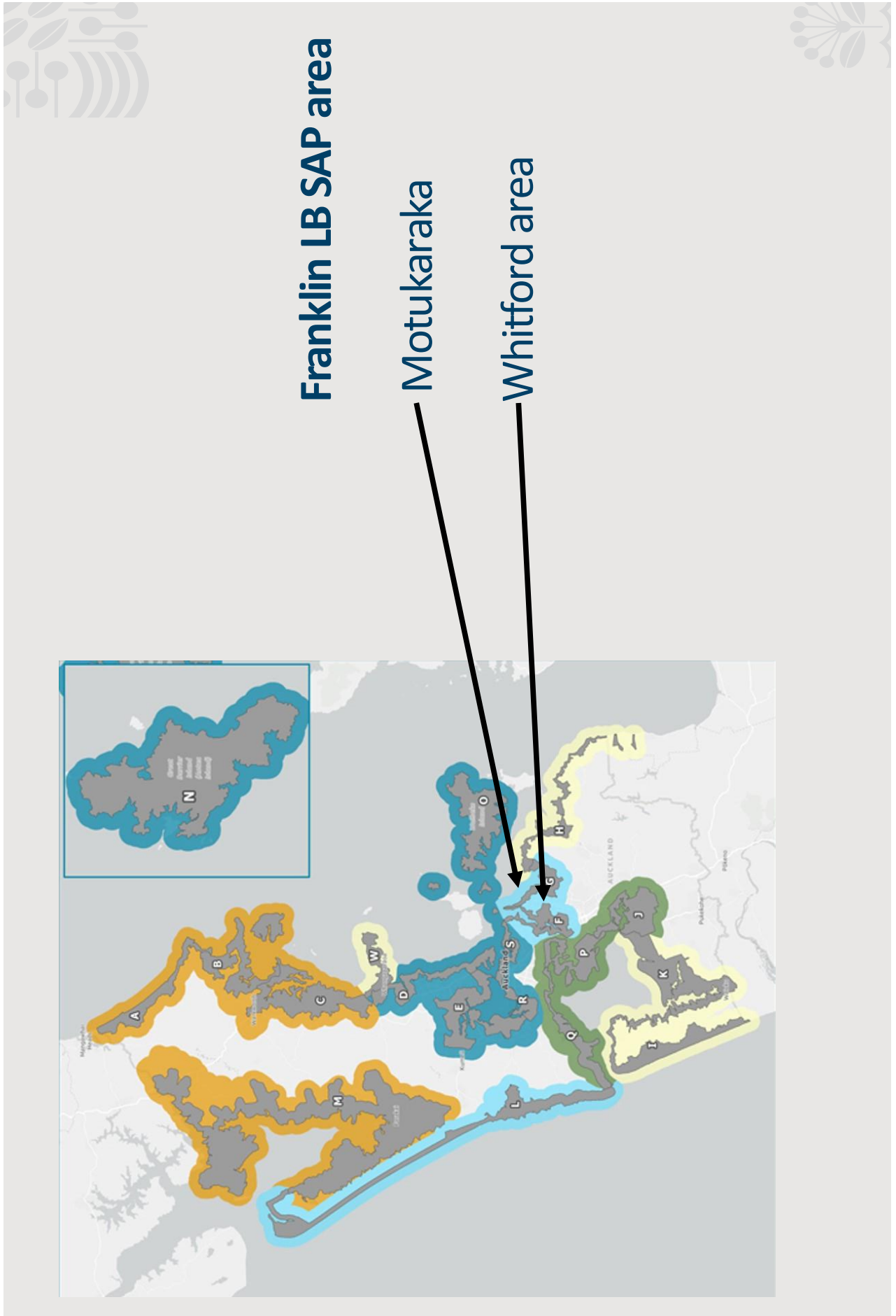

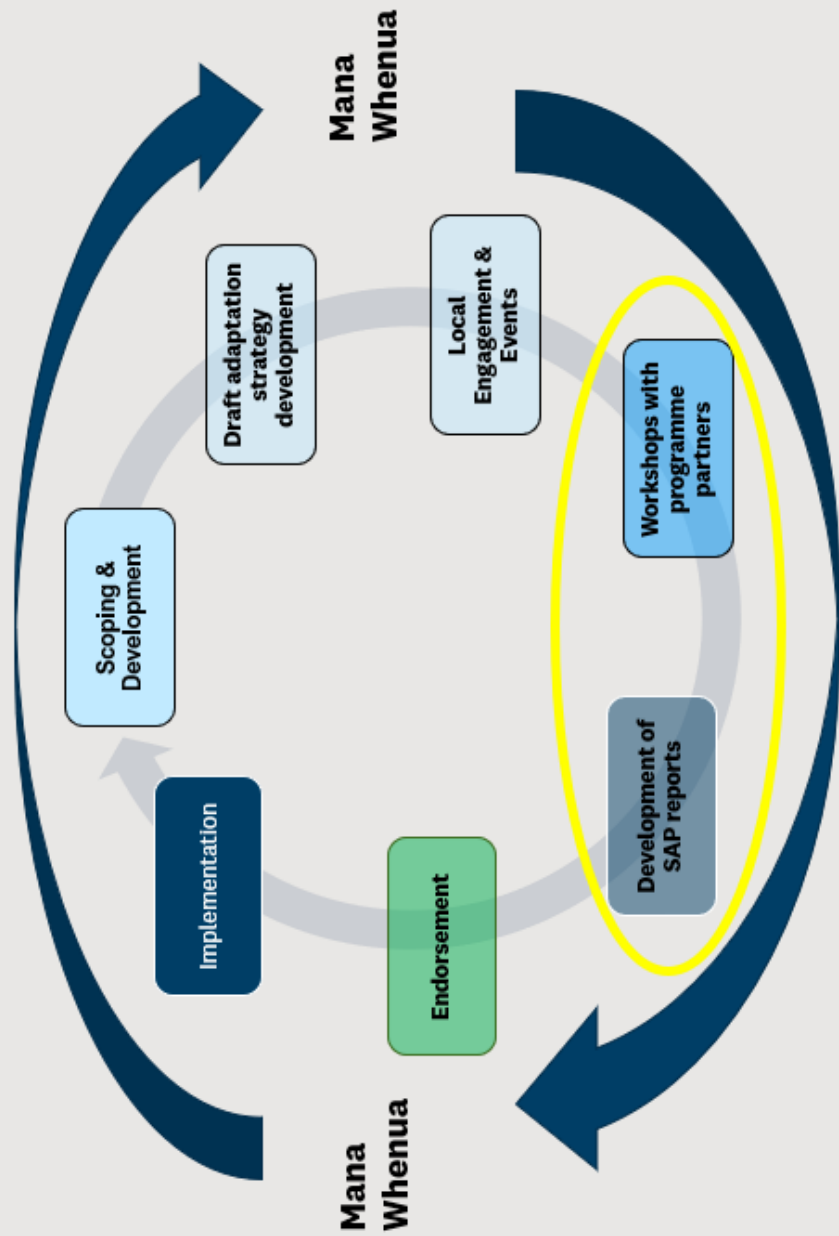

- **High climate change** (1m of SLR +)

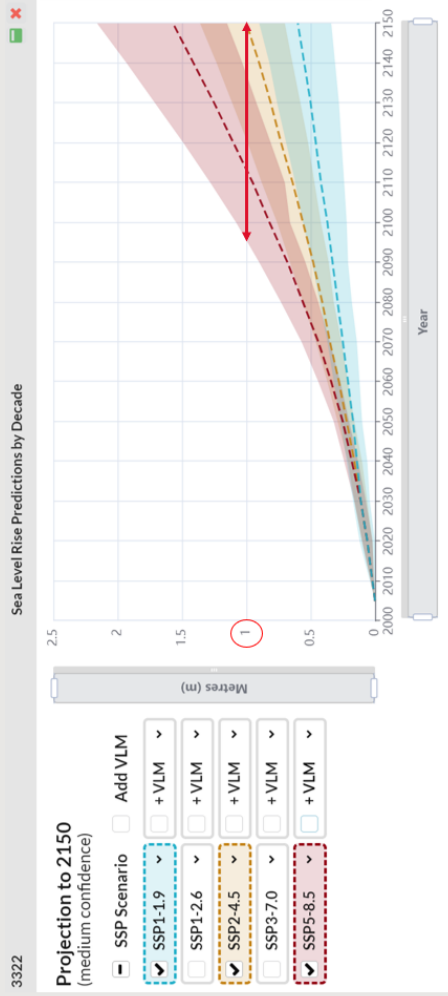
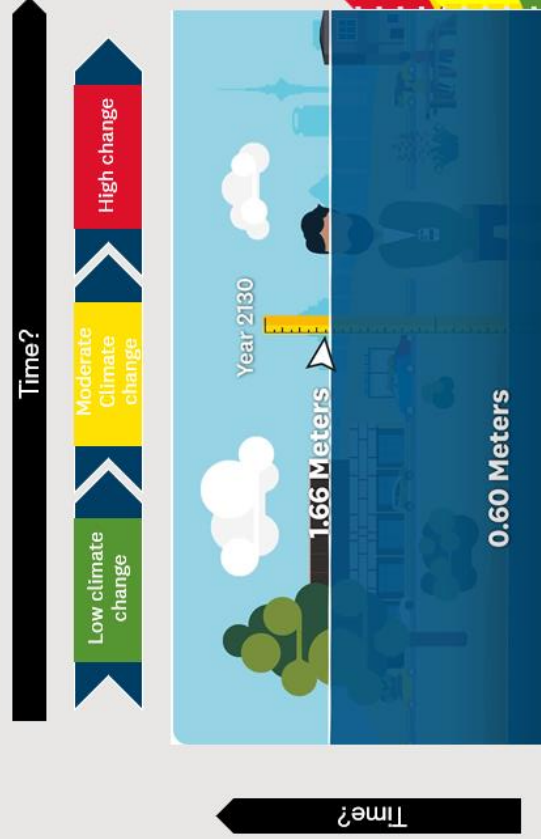

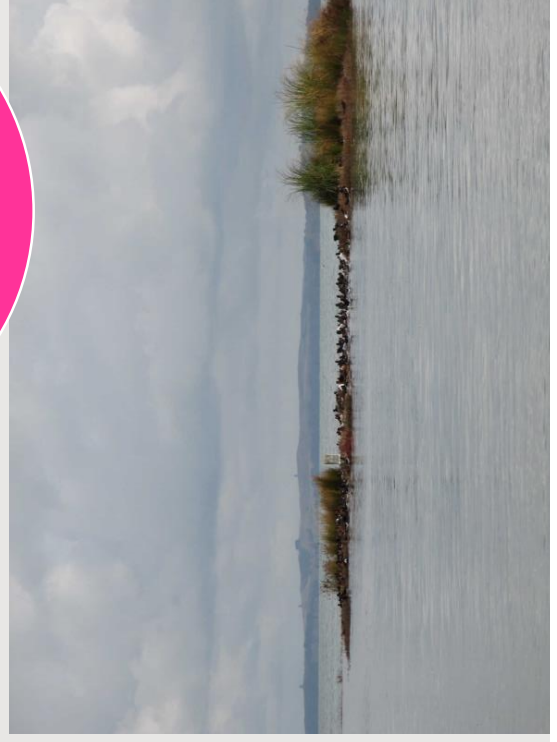


Community feedback Themes

- Need to 'managed retreat' Clifton beach. Walkway is flooding during high tides.
- Cliffs are eroding. Private properties at risk...council shouldn't fund it.
- Historic Stop banks and floodgates (Ayrliess gardens)
- Loss of shell banks and bird roosts with rising tides

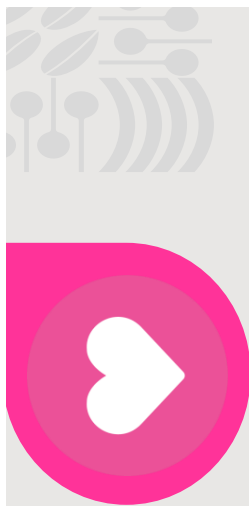

Community Feedback Themes

- Highly valued **coastal walkways** and water access points:
 - Walking, horse riding, cycling
 - Beach access (Whitford Beach)
- **Water access; ramps & jetties**
 - Whitford village
 - Broomfield's
 - Strathfield Lane Esplanade Reserve
 - beach kayaking & fishing
 - Beaches around Broomfield/Strathfield
- Outstanding area for bird roosting/watching
 - Freshwater wetlands - great habitats for birds



Community feedback Themes

- Aspirations for future walking connections to extend the current network.
- Want to ensure that strategies do not preclude the ability for new assets (paths) to be developed.
- Support generally for the strategies where this confirm maintenance of assets/walkways
- Taking an adaptive approach- use and invest in the trails (acknowledging things may change in the future)
- Beachlands South- need for more maintenance and investment in future.
- Water access needs to be supported, mangrove management.

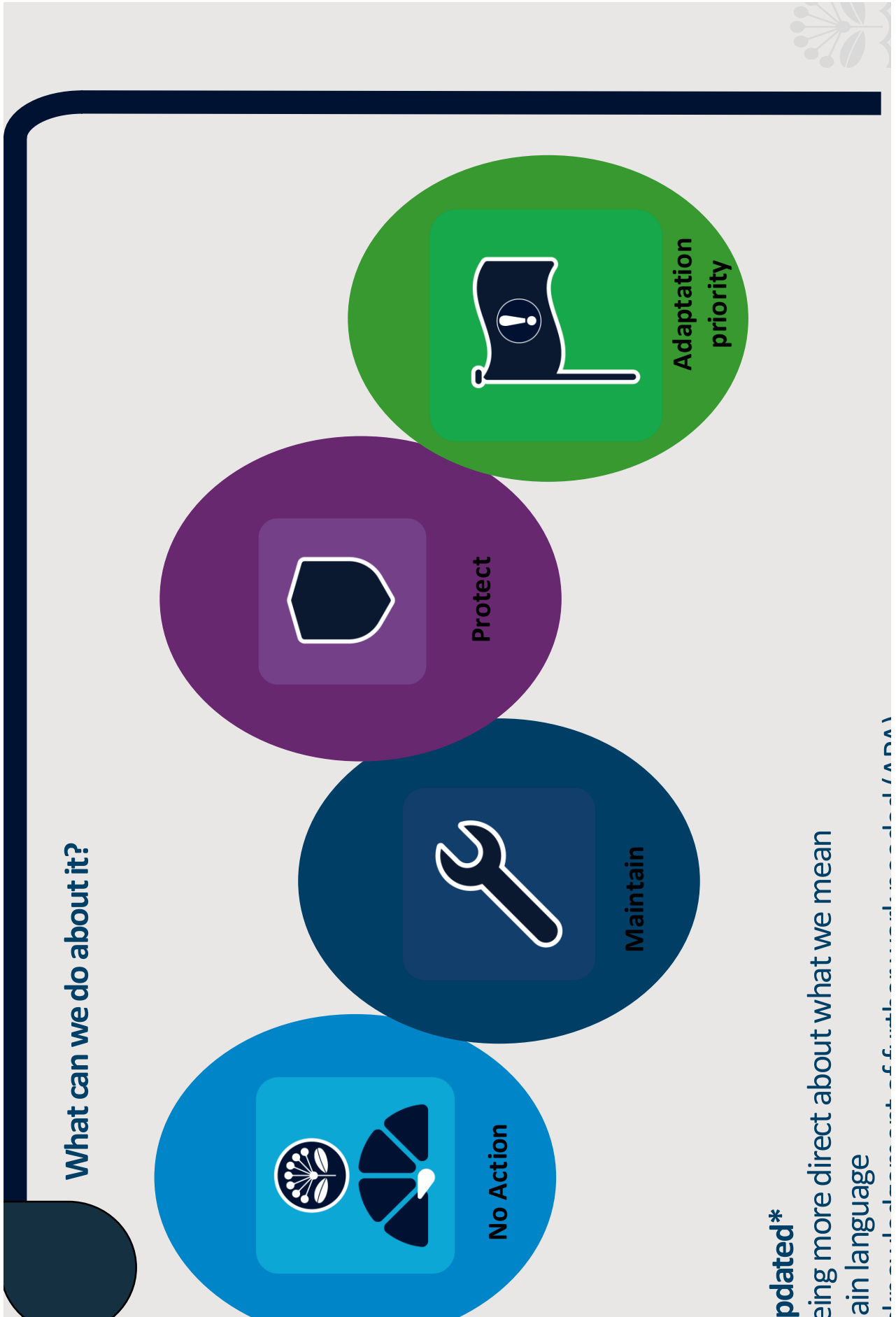
