<b>Expertise:</b>	<p>Our organisation has more than 43 years delivering creative programmes in our communities we have positioned ourselves as Aotearoa's leading Spoken Word Poetry organisation. ### Community benefits

#### Identified community outcomes:

Our Vision is to "Enable young people to express their authenticity while growing a vibrant community that supports them". Working with our priority groups, we use a strength based, equity approach, recognising the innate mana of each individual and community.

Our services provide safe spaces for youth to amplify and articulate their korero. They are a gateway for young people to join the conversation providing leadership tools, connection and platforms for self-advocacy and self-determination.

This creative and transformative work empowers young people to learn to articulate their thoughts clearly, to stand tall in front of an audience, and to listen deeply to others. Our programmes create a sense of belonging. This sense of connection is vital for wellbeing and resilience.

Our impact goes beyond Spoken Word poetry. Our workshops, programmes and mentoring foster crucial life skills. These are skills that serve young people well in all aspects of life, from education to employment to community leadership.

- Connect our communities, through community activities, creative arts, sports and events

Our Spoken Word programmes provide safe spaces for diverse communities to come together in solidarity, voice their issues and challenges, and grow their collective resilience. The Spoken Word artform in its essence is a healthy way for community to express themselves allowing community to build protective factors, uplift and enhance their mana, and manifest hope for their future.

Our organisation works with communities who have significant numbers of marginalised young people who are at higher risk of poor outcomes. Currently this includes Maori, Pasifika, Rainbow, and Muslim young people. The issues that these communities face are xenophobia, racism, discrimination, homophobia, transphobia, mental unwellness, alcohol and substance abuse, bullying, socioeconomic, cultural and education barriers, unemployment, violence and isolation. Our programmes provide spaces for these communities to be truly seen, felt, and heard, and allow for authentic conversation and connection.

We hold the largest network of Spoken Word Artists, and we are the largest employer of poets in Aotearoa – many are our award-winning programme alumni such as Nga Hine Pukorero (Creative NZ Te Waka Toi Award), Takunda Muzondiwa (NZ Poetry Slam National Champion), Aigalefili Fepulieai-Tapuai (Supreme Youth Advocacy Award - Pacific Cooperation Foundation Youth Leadership) and Rehekorero (Trans-Tasman Slam Champions).	This team of community facilitators are contracted to support delivery of our projects.

**Demographics**

**Māori outcomes:**

- *Māori led - either a Māori organisation that is applying or Māori directed (came about as a request from Māori), Māori involvement in the design/concept, Māori focus - tikanga (practices), mātauranga (knowledge), reo (language), Māori participation - Māori priority group, target group, high representation or Māori staff delivering*

We are an indigenous led organisation who is committed to delivering a rights-based service that recognises, respects, and demonstrates our responsibilities to Te Tiriti O Waitangi. Our commitment to Te Tiriti is reflected in our Trust Deed, Values, Operations and Service Delivery, Approach, Evaluation, and deliberate investment into the rangatahi and whanau that we both represent and serve. For many Māori, Spoken Word is a form of language and culture revitalisation. Māori youth have gravitated strongly towards Spoken Word Poetry as it encourages them to engage with their traditional practices and speak to their history, aspirations, triumphs, and challenges. We seek to build mana enhancing relationships within our community, empowering tino rangatiratanga and mana motuhake of rangatahi.

**Accessible to people with disabilities**

Yes - Our work is mainly held at secondary schools and community centres which are all well equipped to provide access for those with physical disabilities. Upon entry into our programmes, we take into account the unique needs of each individual so that we can ensure they are comfortable and can fully participate.

**Healthy environment approach:**

Promote smoke-free messages, Include waste minimisation (zero waste) messages, Healthy options for food and drink, including water as the first choice, Encouraging active lifestyles including movement or fitness programmes, Encourage the reduction of carbon emissions or increase community resilience to the impacts of climate change\*

We work in a holistic manner taking into consideration Te Whare Tapa Wha physical, mental, whanau, and spiritual wellbeing (which includes relationship to whenua) of the young people. These themes are addressed within the shared space through whakawhiti korero / talanoa.

**Does your project support any genders, ages or ethnicities specifically?**

Last year our team delivered:

604 Workshops with 9,091 Workshop Participants

29 Events with 2,317 Event Participants

Overall, we worked with 11,408 young people.

62% of participants were female, 27% male, 19% Rainbow. 23% of participants were Maori, 55% were Pasifika, 9% South East Asian and 7% of African descent.

### Community benefits

#### Identified community outcomes:

ACAT's free counselling service offers significant community benefits by addressing mental health challenges faced by older adults, which are closely tied to their physical well-being. Mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, loneliness, and social isolation can lead to chronic health conditions, rapid physical decline, and even premature mortality. Given the projected increase in the ageing population, the lack of targeted mental health services for older adults is a critical oversight, with serious consequences for both individuals, the broader healthcare system and societal participation.

By providing free, tailored counselling that is accessible to all older adults, we help older adults manage these challenges, which in turn improves their overall health and well-being. Early

intervention in mental health not only prevents the exacerbation of physical health issues but also reduces the strain on the healthcare system, offering a more sustainable solution for ageing populations.

Additionally, the service promotes social integration by helping older adults re-engage with their communities, reducing isolation and enhancing quality of life. Addressing these mental health needs is not only a moral responsibility but also an economically sound strategy for improving public health outcomes, ultimately benefiting the wider community by fostering a more resilient and connected society.

Age Concern Auckland’s free counselling service plays a vital role in fostering community connection by addressing the isolation and mental health challenges faced by older adults. Throughout the ageing process, many experience profound levels of grief and loss, not only from the death of loved ones, but also from the loss of independence, health, relationships, mobility, and social status. These changes can contribute to feelings of diminished personhood and increased loneliness, making it harder for older adults to engage in community life. Loneliness and social disconnection are significant issues among this population, often leading to poor mental and physical health. By providing professional counselling, we empower older adults to rebuild confidence, re-engage with their communities, and participate more fully in social, creative, and recreational activities.

Confidence, self-esteem, determination, independence, positivity, and resilience are themes that significantly influence the overall health and quality of life in older adults. The vast array of health research has irrefutably shown time and again the links between mental health, physical health, and mortality for older adults. Positive mental wellbeing is a critical factor in maintaining physical health and prolonging life expectancy. Older adults who maintain high levels of confidence and self-esteem are more likely to engage in health-promoting behaviours, stay connected in their communities, seek medical attention when needed, and recover more quickly from illnesses.

Counselling serves as a bridge to community participation, helping individuals overcome barriers of grief, anxiety, and loss of purpose, which can prevent them from engaging in social opportunities. Our counselling service helps older adults process these complex emotions, rebuild confidence, and re-engage with their communities to enhance their overall well-being. This directly aligns with the funding priority to connect communities through community activities, creative arts, sports, and events by ensuring older adults have the emotional support needed to be able to engage meaningfully in these opportunities.

Our holistic service provision approach means we are able to provide clients with access to fitness classes and other community groups focused on health and wellness. These resources support older adults in adopting healthy habits, helping to reduce mental health issues and enhancing overall quality of life in a supportive, community-driven environment.

<b>Summary:</b>	Auckland Library of Tools (ALoT) is a volunteer-run, not for profit organisation. We are seeking funding to hire a specialist contractor. Currently we are unable to offer the level of service we would like, as we are reliant on volunteers. Hiring a staff member will enable us to grow more rapidly, increase our operating hours, enhance our educational offering, improve key services and establish better systems for tool maintenance and repair.		
<b>Expertise:</b>	Founded in 2019 with minimal resources, ALoT has become the largest tool library in Aotearoa and a pioneering lending library. Run by over 20 dedicated volunteers, many of whom have been with ALoT for years, we offer effective services thanks to our experienced team. Despite challenges like COVID-19, we adapted to continue serving members. In 2024, with WMIF funding, we collaborated with Repair Cafe Aotearoa to establish Repair & Share, the fastest-established and first regular repair cafe in the country. The initiative involved 50+ volunteers, repairing 446 items, preventing 550kg of waste, and reducing 4,498kg of CO2 emissions. The ALoT team is made up of a diverse range of skills and expertise that have contributed greatly to our success.

### Community benefits

**Identified community outcomes:**

ALoT is a community hub that reduces consumption and environmental costs while making tools and DIY knowledge accessible. Most of our tools are donated, repurposing those no longer used and preventing waste. We also offer high-quality professional tools that many households can't typically afford. By centralizing tool sharing, we've unlocked hidden resources within the community, cutting environmental and financial costs across activities like woodworking, gardening, home repairs, and more. ALoT enhances community resilience by reducing reliance on specialized services and costly tools, especially during the current cost-of-living crisis. This service has the potential to significantly improve social outcomes, fostering self-sufficiency and community empowerment. We host events open to the public, and anyone can become a member. Funding a staff member will allow us to open more, greatly improving the convenience of our service, and enable us to make



more progress with maintenance and repair. This will also free up the capacity of our volunteers, allowing them to use and develop their skills in other ways to support and improve our services and long-term financial sustainability and services.

- Auckland Library of Tools connects communities by promoting a sharing economy that reduces waste, consumerism, and environmental impact. We provide a hub where people from diverse backgrounds can access tools and resources, learn new skills, and connect with others through DIY projects, workshops and repair cafes. By encouraging the repair and reuse of items, this fosters a culture of sustainability, knowledge sharing, and empowerment, helping participants develop long-term repair skills while reducing reliance on disposable goods. **Māori outcomes:**

ALoT aims to support whakapapa and foster community through its membership-based structure, where members participate in achieving its purpose. We practice Kotahitanga by collaborating with other organizations and seek stronger ties with Māori groups to align with te ao Māori. We incorporate te reo Māori into communications and are mindful of tikanga, ensuring waste is separated, and food scraps and organic materials are composted back to Papatuanuku. We educate new volunteers unfamiliar with te ao Māori about tikanga and te reo, with core volunteers sharing their knowledge. ALoT is committed to te Tiriti o Waitangi, ensuring Tangata Whenua and Tangata Tiriti work together to enhance the wellbeing of people, the environment, and the planet.

**Accessible to people with disabilities**

Yes - ALoT & Repair & Share will be made accessible to people with disabilities by ensuring physical accessibility, such as wheelchair-friendly spaces, we are currently working on improving this by installing a ramp out front (there is a small low step). We have clear signage and accessible seating options. Volunteers and staff can be trained to support people with various needs, creating an inclusive environment. We already have two different member's who are deaf, we have made an admin note on their account so anyone serving them can see this note and how the member likes to communicate, i.e. one prefers who offer pen and paper. We would like to increase our open hours, which we intend to do as part of this project, giving more options to access us.

**Healthy environment approach:**

Promote smoke-free messages, Include waste minimisation (zero waste) messages, Encourage the reduction of carbon emissions or increase community resilience to the impacts of climate change\*

The core focus of our project is waste reduction. We have compost bins on site and encourage upcycling and reuse. The core team are zero waste advocates We promote sustainability by enabling community members to share resources, reducing the need for individual purchases and minimizing the environmental impact of manufacturing, transportation, and disposal. By

increasing access to tools for eco-friendly projects, such as gardening, home energy efficiency, and green construction, it fosters a resilient community that can better adapt to climate challenges while reducing overall carbon footprints.

ALoT encourages the reduction of carbon emissions and increases community resilience to climate change in several ways. By promoting the shared use of tools rather than individual ownership, we reduce the need for mass production and the associated carbon footprint of manufacturing, packaging, and transportation of these items. With fewer tools being purchased and disposed of, less waste ends up in landfills, further lowering environmental impact. Additionally, by fostering repair and reuse through activities like Repair Cafes, the library helps extend the life of products and reduces the demand for new goods, contributing to a circular economy. In terms of resilience, ALoT strengthens community bonds by providing a space where people can learn new skills, collaborate on projects, and share knowledge about sustainable practices. We enable individuals to undertake climate-conscious actions like building more energy-efficient homes, growing their own food, or repairing damaged items, which can help communities better adapt to environmental challenges. By making tools and knowledge accessible, the library empowers individuals to take more sustainable actions, reducing their reliance on external resources and enhancing their ability to cope with the impacts of climate change.

The site is a non-smoking site, and smoking or vaping is not encouraged and is rarely seen.

**Does your project support any genders, ages or ethnicities specifically?**

We don't specifically target anyone, however, we have a high percentage of female and gender diverse members and volunteers, a group that is usually under-represented in the DIY space.

We require funding to help fund a contractor which will allow us to grow more rapidly, increase our hours of operation, and deliver key improvements to our service in this phase of growth. This will improve our long-term financial sustainability, and improve our services, with a focus on health and safety, and ensure that we are better able to maintain our large selection of tools and equipment.

Partial funding will limit our ability to fully achieve our goals. Without a dedicated person running the library we won't be able to develop a comprehensive business growth strategy or marketing plan to ensure long-term financial sustainability. Building relationships with underserved communities and understanding their needs will be challenging without the necessary leadership to guide these efforts. Additionally, we won't have the resources to improve core services, implement effective tool maintenance systems, or prioritize health and safety training for our members. Without a consistent contractor, we also cannot create the organizational procedures, such as a volunteer handbook or detailed guides on tool use, that are essential for smooth operations. Our capacity to expand hours, enhance convenience for members, or run educational workshops will remain limited without the staff support needed to execute these initiatives effectively. In short, partial funding will hinder our progress toward creating a more efficient, accessible, and impactful service.

**Cost of participation:** Memberships to ALoT range from \$30 - \$105. For a 6 month membership, we charge \$60 or \$45 for community service card holders, students and gold card holders. For an annual membership, we charge \$105, or \$75 for community service card holders, students and gold card holders. We also charge a small fee (\$1-5) for items with high maintenance or repair needs. Events and Repair & Share Weekly Repair Cafe's are free of charge - although participants can give a small koha or baking.
