Background

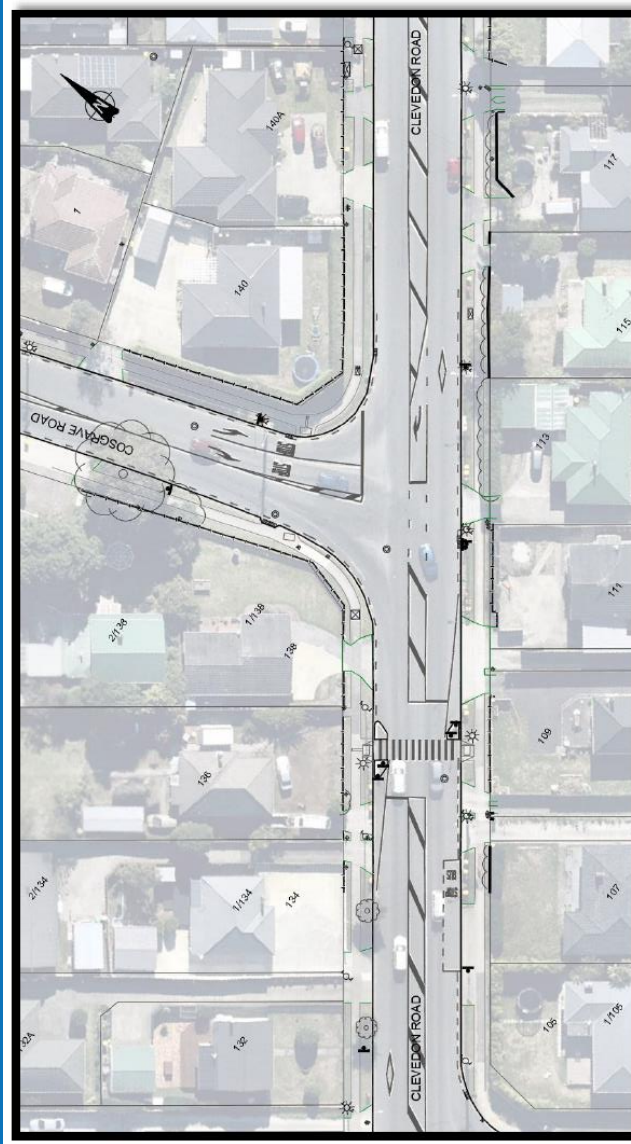


Figure 1: Existing Intersection Layout

- Cosgrave Road / Clevedon Road is currently a stop-controlled intersection, with existing at-grade zebra crossing on Clevedon Road just west of the intersection.
- Both Cosgrave Road and Clevedon Road are classified as Arterial Roads. Posted speed limit is 50km/hr, and 40km/hr during relevant school hours.
- Drivers are experiencing queuing and delays turning in and out of Cosgrave Road during peak hours.
- There were twelve Crashes at the intersection between 2018 and 2022. Seven of the crashes involved making a turn at the intersection.



Proposed Layout

- It is proposed to install traffic signals at the intersection, with signalised pedestrian crossings on all approaches.
- Existing at-grade zebra crossing will be removed.
- Install new shared paths with cycle ramps at the intersection.
- Intersection layout accommodates heavy vehicles including 23m HPMV and Over-dimensional trucks.
- To accommodate this upgrade, we need to remove 5 on-street parking spaces.

Concept Assessment

- Any vertical devices were discounted due to the weak soil in the area which are anticipated to cause noise and vibration issues.
- Fully mountable roundabout option was discounted, as it is not desirable for pedestrian safety, and there is a lack of deflection on the eastern approach to effectively slow vehicles down.
- The preferred option of signalisation provides the best balance for intersection efficiency and safety for all road users.
- It would also allow coordination with the nearby signals at Old Wairoa Road / Cosgrave Road for optimisation on efficiency.
- The rough estimated cost for construction based on the recommended concept is about \$1,000,000.



Current Status and High-level timeline

- Internal consultation completed.
- We are seeking Local Board's early feedback and permission to go head with public consultation.
- Public consultation ~ 8 weeks.
- Design changes on consultation feedback and safety audit ~ 4 weeks
- Detailed design (SW, signal design, pavement etc) ~ 8 weeks
- Traffic Control Committee Resolution, TMP, contractor appointment ~ 8 weeks
- Construction around October.

Background



- Raised pedestrian platform installed 2020/2021 as part of Community Safety Fund projects.
- Noise and vibration issues due to weak soil in the area. Any vertical devices would amplify the vibration from trucks, even with retrofitting the table ramps or alternative vertical devices.
- It is proposed to remove the raised element of the crossing, with careful considerations on types of at-grade crossing facilities.



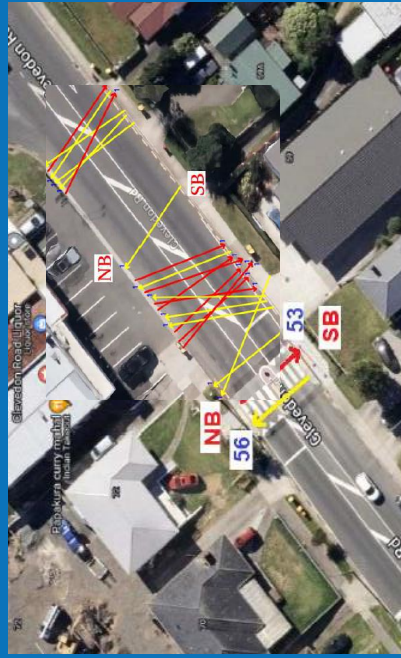
Background – Crash history



- There was 1 crash in the vicinity of the crossing in the past five years, which involved a vehicle pulled out from the parking area in front of the shops into the path of the oncoming truck. This crash occurred in 2019 before the raised table construction.
- There was 1 crash at the nearby Grove Road / Clevedon Road intersection in the past five years, which involved fail to give-way at the intersection.
- Given the existing crash record, the intersection and pedestrian crossing was considered operating relatively safely.



Background – Pedestrian and vehicle volume



- 24 hours Pedestrian counts were undertaken during school term on a typical weekday and a Saturday. A total of 133 and 79 pedestrians were recorded on the weekday and the Saturday respectively.
- The survey also suggests that majority of people (82%) used the zebra crossing, while some jaywalking (18%) in front of the shops on a typical weekday.
- Both the current zebra crossing and Grove Road / Clevedon intersection are operating relatively efficiently, with acceptable queuing and delay.



Option 0 - at-grade zebra crossing

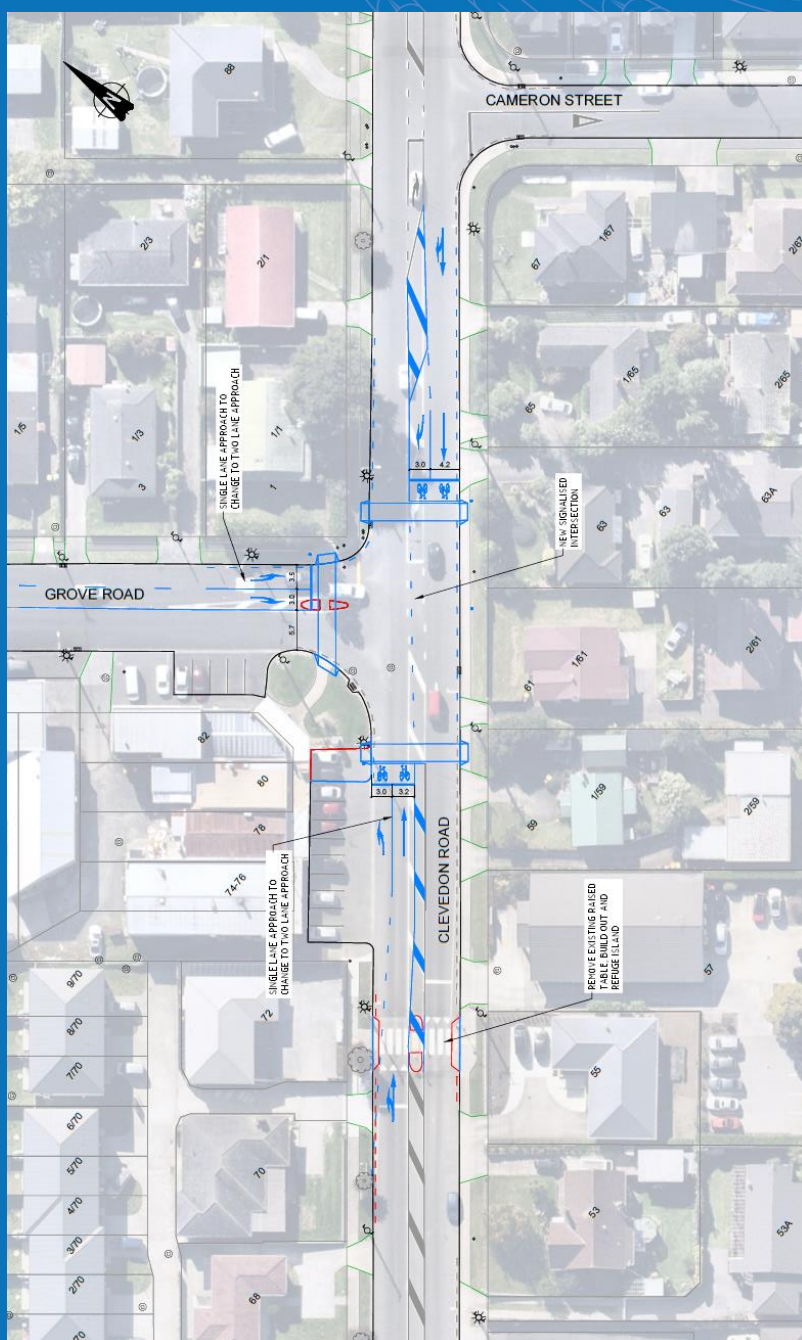
- Removing the raised element and retaining the crossing as an at-grade zebra crossing was considered.
- However, given the current operating speed on Clevedon Road, this option is discounted due to the potential safety implication.
- This type of crossing is similar to the existing at-grade zebra crossing near 44 Clevedon Road. There were 7 crashes in the vicinity of the crossing in the past five years, including 4 involved pedestrians. We are closely monitoring this site for improvements, and another at-grade zebra on Clevedon Road would hence not be recommended.



Option 1 – Mid-block signals

- Remove raised table and replaced with at-grade mid-block pedestrian signals at the same location.
- Install high-friction surfacing on each approach.
- Existing tree adjacent to crossing location.
- Potentially improve visibility at Grove Road / Clevedon Road intersection by providing about 7 parking removal.
- Note that the plans are high-level concept plans for feasibility and optioneering purpose.

Option 2 – Intersection signals



- Remove raised zebra crossing, and install at-grade traffic signals at the intersection, with signalised pedestrian crossings on all approaches.
- A kerb buildout outside the shops to accommodate pedestrian crosswalk, result in parking loss. A total of about 9 parking loss would be expected
- Tight north-eastern corner due to the property boundary.
- Back-to-back right turns into Grove Road and Cameron Street

- Both options are expected to address the existing vibration issue. Feasibility and traffic modelling suggested that safety and efficiency performance can be met through detailed designs.
- Both options would support future Mill Road Corridor and are anticipated to integrate with the new and enhanced arterial roads and connections from Mill Road.
